Comments

Board Member Julie Hollingsworth had the opportunity to participate in South Side High School's judging for their annual Beautification Project that allows students the opportunity to apply mathematics. Member Hollingsworth reminded the community that this is the last week of the legislative session. The Budget is being finalized and there is a big difference between Senate and House versions, K12 funding and CTE funding, as well as, voucher expansion.

Board Member Jennifer Matthias is concerned with voucher growth. Public schools need resources, please pay attention, don't just read the headlines, earmarking 1/3 of the budget for private schools and their enrollment is not increasing. Our public schools are not failing. For the full story, her letter to the editor was in Saturday's paper. She did her last JA for a Day at Whitney Young for this school year. She encourages the community to partake as it is very rewarding.

Board Member Anne Duff saw on social media that they are having a Pioneer Award Event, for the first time ever, at Electric Works. FWCS' Riley Johnson is one of the honorees. Ms. Duff encourages attendance as voting is done at the event.

Board President Maria Norman also participated in the South Side High Schools' Beautification project. President Norman also reminded the community that tomorrow is the first of five meetings regarding the Safety & Well-Being referendum, where we will be getting community input on the plan. This is an opportunity for FWCS to hear your voice and your opinion. Meetings will be held: Tuesday, April 25, 6-8pm at North Side, PL room; Thursday, May 4, 6-8pm at South Side, cafeteria; Wednesday, May 17, 6-8pm at Snider, cafeteria; Tuesday, May 23, 6-8pm at Northrop, cafeteria; and Monday, June 5, 1-3pm at Wayne/NTA, cafeteria.

Board Member Rohli Booker also judged in the South Side High Schools' Beautification project. She really enjoyed seeing how well the students do presenting. Ms. Booker spoke about a young lady who presented last year and the positive change. Having this opportunity boosts their confidence and it is amazing to see.

Board Member Noah Smith also commented on the legislative budget regarding voucher expansion and CTE. He appreciates it, but would like to have public schools funded properly. Mr. Smith congratulated Ashley Sloboda for her award on her piece she did earlier this year on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. Her work was very timely in what is going on in the world. Been a lot of tragedy in the nation, encourages action in addition to just having thoughts and prayers. Member Smith mentioned a FWCS high school student recently diagnosed with Leukemia.

Superintendent Dr. Mark Daniel appreciates all that has been done with contacting legislators during this session. He is asking to give FWCS a chance to ramp things up for CTE and wants to keep conversations going. Dr. Daniel thanked the team, for their assistance in expanding internships, through the Career Academy and at each school. The ultimate five-year goal is 100% of our graduates to have a work place experience. We will have opportunities both internally, here at FWCS and externally, in the community. Having this experience can set a person on a path to what they may want to do in their post-secondary lives. We are connecting on our career clusters to have vertical alignment in three major areas: Health Science/Human Services, Manufacturing/ Engineering/Trades and Business/Technology/Fine Arts. We are starting the mapping out sequence. Basic, Intermediate to graduating with a certification. We have to drive the cost down to attend the Career Center. We need private investment, pro bono work, etc.
