SEACREST HISTORY

The Country Day School Movement

The Country Day School movement began in America during the late 1800s into the turn of the 1900s. Families in urban areas sought out a strong educational experience for their children as an option to a boarding school. The Country Day School concept was created as a holistic student learning environment that would foster learning and community.

There are many Country Day Schools throughout the U.S., but Seacrest remains the only Country Day School in Southwest Florida.

The originators of The Country Day School couldn't conceive of the changes that our world would go through during the 20th and 21st centuries, but they created a concept that is good for humanity; giving a child a supportive environment to learn, grow, and become a good global citizen.

1982

Seacrest Founders Lloyd and Norma Sheehan meet with Jane Kern to discuss their dream for a school. They created the analytical framework of their new school and name it Seacrest. The Sheehans fund the school for 10 years.

1983 Seacrest Opens

On a September day in 1983 Jane Kern, along with one teacher, Becky Herrman, holds Seacrest's first, first day of school with 18 three- and four-year-old students.
