COVID-19 Symptoms (e.g., fever, dry cough, sore throat, diarrhea, runny nose, headache, loss of taste or smell, difficulty breathing)	Send home and recommend contact with primary care provider for recommendations regarding need for testing. If negative COVID-19 test result (PCR) or (antigen- consider retesting if using antigen 24 hours after negative test) or COVID-19 is ruled out by primary care provider (something else other than COVID-19 infection is reason for symptoms), can return 24 hours after fever resolves and symptoms have improved. without the use of fever-reducing medications.

If you can end your isolation after day 5 wear a <u>well-fitted mask</u> around others for a total of 10 days, especially in indoor settings, and continue to follow other preventive measures and masking guidance.

Next Steps

- 1. Identify Close Contacts.
 - Recommend <u>testing</u> of contacts, prioritize symptomatic contacts.
 - Close contacts may need <u>quarantine</u>.
 (ex. If they are symptomatic)

- **1.** Proceed with isolation of case and notification of close contacts.
- 2. If reported CCHS will follow up confirming receipt of the report and provide a contact for any questions.

Contact to COVID-19 Positive

- **1.** Quarantine not required.
- 2. Get tested between days 3-5 after being exposed to someone with COVID-19.
 - If the test is positive, follow <u>isolation</u> instructions.
- 3. Wear a well-fitting mask around others for 10 days, especially indoors.
- **4.** If you develop symptoms, get tested right away and stay home (isolation).

Continue to use preventive measures such as the use of a mask/face covering, social distancing from others and proper handwashing.

Work restrictions after a close contact should be reviewed with your workplace. No notification of CCHS require

to Notify all employees and their
authorized representatives who may

case within one business day in a

information.
