Trinity’s after-school programs reinforce and support our Christian mission and honor our commitment to an unhurried education. Our programs provide a rich experience with books, toys, games, crafts, curriculum-related activities, and opportunities for students to extend their learning informally after school.

For children in grades TK–8, Trinity’s after-school programs provide lots of time with friends, as well as the attentive adult supervision required for all students who are on campus after school hours. Students who participate in clubs, sports, and music groups are able to go to these during the after-school time. Parents share that their children love attending and are able to complete their homework, which allows for more family time in the evening.

TK/K Program • 1:15–2:30 p.m. • \$1,000 per year

TK/K Program • 1:15–5:30 p.m. • \$5,000 per year

- Supervised free play (art, puzzles, building manipulatives, imaginative play)
- Crafts (Perler beads, necklace making, coloring, sewing, painting)
- Small-group games (center time with card games and board games)
- Group reading circles (space for resting and quiet time)



Grades TK–6 Program • 2:30–5:30 p.m. • \$4,000 per year

- Snacks provided
- Supervised unstructured outdoor play.
- Homework time for students in grades 2–6
- TK–first grade group reading circles
- Board games
- Time for free play or continued homework



Grades 7–8 Program • 3:00–5:00 p.m.

\$400 per sports season or \$1,000 per year

- Snacks provided
- Time to complete homework
- Place to relax and be with friends
- Students may be enrolled in TLC for the fall (Aug. 23–Oct.27), winter (Oct. 30–Feb. 16), and/or spring (Feb. 20–May 30) or for the entire school year
