Children who turn six after December 1 must begin to receive instruction no later than the first day of school the following September.

Kindergarten doesn't have a required curriculum, although Letter of Intent, IHIP, Quarterly Reports and Year-End Assessment are still necessary if your child's age mandates reporting^{*}. Kindergarten might include: Reading Readiness, Math Readiness, Language Development, Health Education including personal safety and AIDS instruction, Music, Physical Education, In addition-patriotism and citizenship, alcohol/drugs/tobacco abuse, bicycle/highway safety.
