# Guidelines for Home Education Participation

The Twin Valley School District has established the following guidelines for home education participation in co-curricular activities, academic courses, and/or career and technical education programs. (See TVSD Board Policies [137](#), [137.2](#), and [137.3](#) for detailed information).

### **Procedures:**

1. Enroll in Twin Valley School District through the [online registration portal](#).
2. Email or submit a written request to the building principal.  
Include the following information:
  - Student Name
  - Date of Birth
  - Grade Level
  - Requested Course or Service
  - Current enrollment (i.e., homeschool, private school, cyber)
  - Parent Signature
  - Parent Address
  - Parent Email
  - Parent Phone
3. Building principal will approve/disapprove the request based on availability.
4. Families will be notified about the schedule.
5. Home education families must request courses on a yearly basis.

### **Additional Information**

- Home education students may participate in academic courses equaling up to one-quarter (1/4) of the school day. At the High School, students may participate in academic courses equaling up to 4.0 credits per school year.
- A home education student may or may not be able to attend due to seating availability in the desired course/service.
- Parents/Guardians of home education students are responsible for transportation.
- Pennsylvania School Code requires students enrolled in Grades 3-8 to participate in PSSA (ELA, Math, Science) and in Grade 11 to participate in the Keystone Exams (Literature, Algebra, and Biology).
- Home education students are not eligible for a diploma from Twin Valley School District unless enrolled as a full-time student for 12<sup>th</sup> Grade at Twin Valley High School and meet all graduation requirements.
