



Literacy will continue to be an area of focus district-wide in the 2023-2024 school year. We are shifting to the 95% Core Phonics Program in grades K-3. This phonics instruction will form the backbone of the structured literacy block that will also incorporate vocabulary, fluency, reading comprehension, written response to reading and more. Teachers in grades K-5 will receive training in the Science of Reading. Teachers in grades 4-12 will receive training in disciplinary literacy and



writing, with the goal of students reading, writing, and engaging in discussion in every core class every day.



Continually expanding course offerings, combined with clubs and extracurricular activities, including Envirothon, Lego Robotics, visual and performing arts, and a wide range of athletics, challenge students to find their passion while building connections to their school community. Summer experiences such as STEAM Camp, Down on the Farm, Wellness Camp, and Summer Reading ensure that learning continues through the summer and kids are excited and ready to return to school in the fall.


In order to attract new business to Ohio, various economic development incentives are required to compete with other States for the new business. One of the economic development incentives is property tax abatements. The majority of the new businesses coming to Ohio are requesting a 100% property tax abatement for

15 years. New businesses also request Tax Increment Financing (TIF), which are payments derived from the increased assessed value of any improvement to real property beyond that amount are directed towards a separate fund to finance the construction of public infrastructure defined within the TIF legislation.

The school district does not initiate property tax incentives. The school district only gets involved if the new business is requesting an incentive above the maximum abatement without school district approval. The school district tries to negotiate the maximum payment in exchange for approving the requested abatement. The payments can be in the form of lump sum cash payments or annual per square foot payments from the new business, income tax sharing agreements, and payments from JEDZs or JEDDs.

Economic development incentives are here to stay, and the school district is an integral part of that process. The district tries to negotiate the best deal possible while not being a roadblock to economic development.

### BUILDING PROJECT UPDATE Robert Tennell. Project Manager



The current building master plan is now entering the final stages and we will soon open the renovated Kirkersville Elementary in August of 2024 and a new 800 student Watkins Elementary in 2025. This new elementary will be located just east of the current soccer fields on our eastern campus. At Kirkersville, crews have already installed radon systems in the existing spaces, abated all hazardous materials, removed the four modular buildings, and completely demolished the "old" material inside the building. The 76,000 square foot Watkins Elementary will be a single story brick building equipped with the up-to-date features found in the previously renovated and new buildings.



We are nearing the completion on the new athletic fields and tennis courts located next to the intersection of Warrior Way and SR 40. The six new tennis courts and softball fields were used for the first time this past spring, and the baseball field will be ready this year. In addition to these new fields, a renovated concession building and installed fence will be ready for fall activities at our existing football field/track facility.

### TRANSPORTATION UPDATE

We are excited to transport your children to and from school this year. All students wanting transportation should have completed their Final Forms transportation information. If you have any changes, those changes must be made prior to August 3rd for them to be effective for the first day of school. Any changes made after August 3rd will not be

**ready until August 31st.** Students' busing information will be emailed on August 10th. Below are some frequently asked questions about transportation. If you have any additional questions, please contact the transportation department.

# Q: I live in one elementary school boundary. My child's daycare/babysitter lives within a different elementary school boundary. What should I do?

**A:** SWL schools will not transport children across school boundaries. You will need to either transport your own child or find a daycare/babysitter within your school boundary.

## Q: We are planning on moving to another area within the district, can my child start attending their new school before we move?

**A:** No. Students will need to attend the building in which you currently reside until proof of a change of address is provided.

#### Q: What if the address used for transportation changes?

**A:** Prior to August 4th, you can update Final Forms on our website. After August 4th, you will need to update Final Forms. Please note that any requests made after the beginning of the school year will result in a 2-week processing period.

#### Q: The bus goes right by my house. Why can't it stop at my driveway?

**A:** School bus stops are placed in central locations to help shorten route lengths and times. The transportation department makes every effort to see that these stops are safe and have appropriate walking routes to them. The higher frequency of stops made by the bus increases the dangers of accidents due to impatient motorists eager to pass the bus.

#### Q: Who has the authority to change my bus stop or route?

**A:** The transportation department is the only authority that can make a change to bus routes or stops. If you believe your bus stop is unsafe and/or does not fit the bus stop criteria set forth by the district, please contact the transportation department.

#### Q: I cannot see my child's bus stop from the house. Are there state laws about bus stop locations?

**A:** No law requires a parent to see the bus stop from home. Students in grades K-8 in Ohio may be assigned to a bus stop up to one-half mile from their home. We encourage parents to accompany their child to the bus stop whenever possible. This teaches the child safe habits of walking to and from the bus stop and may give the parent peace of mind.

### FOOD SERVICE UPDATE

We are excited to welcome back and serve students for the upcoming school year. A nutritional breakfast and lunch will continue to be available daily. Breakfast consists of fruit, grain, and milk. Lunch offers a fruit, vegetable, grain, meat/meat alternative, and milk. Students may choose from a variety of selections daily. #### Important items to remember:

- Meals cost \$1.25 for breakfast, \$2.75 K-5 lunch, \$3.00 middle school lunch, \$3.25 high school lunch.
- Extra healthy snacks/drinks are sold daily for an additional cost between \$.50-\$2.00. Parents may add a restriction on their child's account such as "only 1 snack/day" by emailing Carmen Murphy at <a href="mailto:carmurphy@laca.org">carmurphy@laca.org</a>.
- Money should be placed on a student's account prior to meal purchasing. To apply money online via debit/credit card please visit <a href="www.myschoolbucks.com">www.myschoolbucks.com</a>. Please note there is a small convenience fee when paying online. This fee may be recuperated when you purchase 20 lunches at one time resulting in your student receiving one additional bonus meal. You may also send in cash/check with your student in an envelope marked with their name and indicate "lunch \$".
- Free/reduced meal applications must be completed every school year. Please visit <a href="https://www.myschoolapps.com">www.myschoolapps.com</a> before school begins to complete your application for the 2023-24 school year.
- School fees may only be waived or reduced if you qualify for free/reduced meals.

Want a part-time job while the kids are at school? We are hiring substitute food service personnel. Typically subs work 3-5 hours per day as needed between 8:30-1:30. Duties in the kitchen include prepping meals, serving food, and cleaning.
