II. FAMILY PARTICIPATION IN THE DEVELOPMENT AND REVIEW OF POLICY

U.S. Congressman Solomon P. Ortiz Elementary School Parent Advisory Committee, made up of parents, teachers, principals, and community members, developed the school's Family Engagement Policy. III. ANNUAL SCHOOL BOARD FOR TITLE I PARENTS

U.S. Congressman Solomon P. Ortiz Elementary School will ensure an annual meeting for all Title I parents. These meetings should be held during the fall semester. The purpose of these boards is to provide parents with information about guides and services provided by Title I-A using Title I-A funds as indicated in this Family Participation Policy.

Family Participation Policy will be distributed to parents. Parents will be given the opportunity to offer their suggestions for any policy review. Parents may also volunteer in the district or on their school's advisory committee or both.

The annual Title I-A board will be held at accessible times to increase the opportunity for parental involvement. English-Spanish translation will be available. Parents will be notified via flyers written in both languages with the date and time of the board. They will also be contacted by phone calls by volunteer parents, parent educators and parent coordinators. All contact will be made by volunteers who speak two languages, English-Spanish.

IV. SCHOOL-PARENTS CONVENTION

V. TYPES OF FAMILY PARTICIPATION

U.S. Congressman Solomon P. Ortiz Elementary School will provide parents with the opportunity to get involved in their children's education. U.S. Congressman Solomon P. Ortiz Elementary School values parents' contributions at home as those that take place at school and in the community. Reading children at home and talking to them during family meals is as important as volunteering at school or serving on the school counseling committee. Many types of family participation are necessary in a society; school-home-community to help all children succeed. In partnership with the philosophy and mission of the Brownsville Independent School District, each school in its Improvement Plan (CIP) must include the family participation component. All parents and volunteers in the community must meet the District's Criminal Background Review Policy requirements that the State of Texas requires.

VI. ADAPTING PROGRAMS TO THE NEEDS OF OUR COMMUNITY

Each year U.S. Congressman Solomon P. Ortiz Elementary School will assess the needs of parents and children in the community through various measures, including sending parent surveys to homes so that Title I programs can be designed to meet those needs. Workshops and other programs will be available to assist the above needs. Parents will be notified of these opportunities at each school.

Parents will be encouraged to take the initiative and call teachers or school administrators when they have a concern or doubt. Staff will receive training in techniques to improve communication between home and school. Parents may also participate in this training.

VIII. EVALUATION
