Welcome back announcements

First Day of School

The first day of the 2023-2024 school year for ALL STUDENTS will be **Monday, August 28, 2023**. LCTI will be open that day, and all LCTI students will report to homeroom at Parkland before taking transportation to LCTI or reporting to their classes.

Daily Schedule

School will start at **7:40 AM** and will end at **2:44 PM**. Students will be able to enter the building at **7:20 AM**. Morning LCTI students will attend homeroom at Parkland High School (PHS) prior to receiving a bus transfer to LCTI.

Late Activity Bus

The school district provides one late activity bus run each school day. The activity bus will depart from the back of the D-wing at **4:30 PM Monday - Friday** on the days students are in school. Only students engaged in school sponsored and supervised activities are eligible to use the activity bus. Students staying at PHS for activities beyond 4:30 PM must arrange for transportation home.

From the principal's desk



Dear Parents and Guardians:

I hope you are enjoying a wonderful summer with family and friends. I also hope that everyone has had the chance to vacation and spend some quality time together without the stress of school. Our administrative team and the teaching staff are very excited to begin the 2023-2024 school year. Our students and staff accomplished so many great things last year. We look forward to continuing to build upon our longstanding tradition of excellence in the Arts, Academics and Athletics this school year. As we begin a new school year, I would like to give you an update on all of the work we have done throughout the summer to achieve our mission of *Educating the Whole Child*.

Academic Achievement

We continue to focus our preparation and efforts on student growth and achievement. Our administrative team was busy this summer updating our course offerings, student schedules, and academic programs. At PHS, we take pride in fostering a safe, inclusive, and nurturing environment that empowers our students to excel academically, socially, and emotionally. Our staff is committed to providing the highest quality education and support to ensure each student reaches their full potential.

As a reminder, if your child wishes to make any changes to their schedule, they must secure a Schedule Change Request Form in the Counseling Office. **All course change requests must be submitted to the Counseling Office during the first six days of school. Note that course change requests are not available prior to the start of the school year.** Should you have any additional questions or concerns about our academic programming, please contact our Counseling Office at 610-351-5600 or by connecting with your child's counselor through [our website](#).

Student Safety

The safety of our students is first and foremost in our minds as we begin the new school year. Every year, our school district reviews our safety protocols, participates in drills and works to make our campus a safe place for our students and staff. This year was no different. On August 9, our administrative team participated in a district-wide safety drill and we were able to practice our Family Reunification plan that would be enacted if we ever had to evacuate a building for any reason. While we hope to never have to enact this protocol, it was great that we had the chance to practice the process as it remains critically important that our staff is prepared for emergency situations. This school year our staff will continue to engage in PA Safe Schools Act drills and continue to work with our local police and state officials to ensure we are implementing best practices with regard to safety protocols.

Our students also play an important role in maintaining a safe building. In addition to reporting concerning behaviors to teachers and administration in real time, students can also make anonymous reports using the [Safe2Say Something website](#). Please encourage your student(s) to be vigilant about reporting anyone intending to harm themselves or others.

School Culture, Climate, and Structure

Developing a positive student-centered environment is of the utmost importance to our administrative and teaching staff. With that in mind, we have begun plans for the upcoming school year that allow our students to have positive experiences during the school day and after school activities. We are proud of our tradition of excellence in the arts and athletics. Our **sports teams** won 2 East Penn Conference Championships, 10 EPC Championships, 9 District XI Championships, and our Boys Volleyball team won the PIAA State Championship right after school ended this past spring. Our fall sports teams are already preparing for their upcoming seasons.

Key Items for the Return to School

Cafeteria Payment Procedures

Students should always have their School ID with them when they come to school. The PHS Cafeteria is cashless, and the student's School ID will be used for payments. Parents/Guardians should deposit money in their student's [MySchoolBucks.com](https://myschoolbucks.com) account, or mail a check (payable to PSD Cafeteria) to Parkland Food Services, Troxell Building, 2219 N. Cedar Crest Boulevard, Allentown, PA 18104. Please allow time for delivery if using the U.S. Postal Service.



New Personal Device Policy

Students are not permitted to use their personally-owned devices such as laptops, tablets, and cell phones during instructional times during the school day. Instead, students will be required to use their Parkland-assigned Chromebooks or workstation which have the necessary resources to support academic needs for each department. Parkland devices contain web content filtering and cybersecurity protection and therefore provide a safer environment for everyone, reducing the risk of unauthorized access or cyber threats. Open-Campus Wifi will no longer be generally available for students on personally-owned devices, including cell phones.

Counseling corner

Welcome

Welcome to the 2023-2024 school year. The Parkland High School

Counseling staff are available to assist you with any questions or concerns you may have regarding your son or daughter's academic program for the upcoming school year.

STUDENT SCHEDULES

Student schedules were completed by Counseling staff and made available on Friday, August 11. If a student is considering a schedule change, request forms will be available in the Counseling Office the first day of school. Schedule change policies and procedures can be referenced in the Parkland High School Registration Information and Course Descriptions Book. Schedule changes will not be made prior to the first day of school.

Did You Move Over the Summer?

If a student has moved over the summer to a new residence within the Parkland School District, proof of residency (2 forms) must be presented to the Counseling Office as soon as possible. Please call if you have any questions regarding this procedure.



Complete Transcript Release Form

Seniors must complete a transcript release form prior to submitting college applications to the Counseling Office. Students and parents (if the student is under 18 years of age) must sign this form giving Parkland High School permission to release official academic records to colleges/universities. Students indicate on the form whether SAT or ACT scores are to be removed from the high school transcript prior to processing college applications.



Complete Recommendation Profile

If a college is requesting a counselor recommendation, the student must complete a recommendation profile form highlighting individual achievements during the past four years. Seniors need to remember to contact teachers early in the school year if they wish to request a teacher recommendation. A copy of the recommendation profile can be helpful to teachers when preparing student recommendations.



Pay Close Attention to Application Deadlines

Seniors need to remember ten school days are required to process college applications. Please pay close attention to application deadline dates. Submit your materials as early as possible to the Counseling Office. Seniors need to inform their counselor if they are processing an application online. Applications processed through online delivery systems (Common App or Coalition App) require official transcripts and secondary school information. In order to ensure timely processing of your online applications, communication with your counselor is vitally important.



SENIOR ATHLETES

Senior athletes who have not completed the NCAA Initial-Eligibility Clearinghouse form should do so as soon as possible if they are interested in participating in collegiate sports at the Division I or II levels. NCAA procedures for the college-bound student athlete are available online at www.eligibilitycenter.org. Transcript requests should be made through www.parchment.com.

Register for the SAT Reasoning Test

Registration procedures for the 2023-2024 SAT Reasoning Test are posted online at the College Board website, www.sat.org/register. The College Board requires a student photo as part of the registration process and late registration options have changed. The above changes are all part of enhanced security regulations put in place by the College Board.

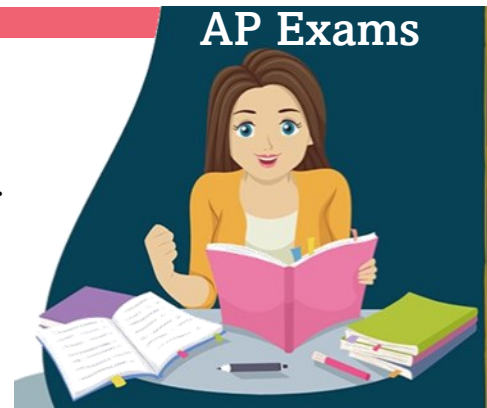
PSAT Scheduled for Saturday, October 14

Juniors and sophomores are encouraged to take the PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Assessment Test) scheduled for **Saturday, October 14, 2023** at Parkland High School. The College Board allows this test to be administered only once every school year. Please mark this date on your calendar for future reference. Registration will take place in the Main Rotunda outside of the Counseling Office in early to mid-September. Students qualifying for free or reduced lunch may be eligible for a fee waiver.

AP Exams

Attention Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Takers

Sign-ups will take place **September 11, 2023 - November 1, 2023**. You must sign up during this period to avoid late fees. The cost is \$97 per exam. To register, please submit a check, payable to Parkland High School, in the correct amount. On the check, please include the student's name, ID number and name(s) of the AP Exam(s) scheduled to be ordered. If you receive free or reduced lunch, please reach out to Mr. Jeremy Gordon in the Counseling Office. Please see Mr. Gordon with any questions.



Juniors and Seniors

ASVAB Testing on September 20

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) will be offered at Parkland High School on **Wednesday, September 20**. The ASVAB is an excellent opportunity for juniors and seniors to complete a career aptitude test that examines different academic, mechanical and technical areas. Students interested in a military career must take this three-hour exam. The exam is free of charge and administered by military testing personnel at the high school; however, there is no obligation to meet with military recruiters if a student completes the test. **Registration for the ASVAB test will take place the first two weeks of September via a Google form in Schoology.**



Class Dues

Class dues are a one-time-only payment of \$20 during your student's high school career. Cash or checks are acceptable forms of payment. Checks should be made payable to Parkland High School and should reference your student's graduating class and student ID# in the memo line.

Parkland High School will offer an SAT Prep Course this fall to help students prepare for the SAT Exam that will be administered on **Saturday, November 4, 2023.**

Students who participate in this course will receive preparation for both the verbal and math portions of the SAT exam. The **verbal** classes will help students prepare for the verbal section of the SAT by providing practice, test taking strategies, and test simulation in the areas of critical reading, evidence-based writing, and contextual vocabulary. The **math** classes will help students prepare for the math section of the SAT by providing practice, test taking strategies, and simulated test taking in the areas of algebra, geometry and trigonometry including problem solving, data analysis, and practice in ratios, rates and proportional relationships.



AFTER-SCHOOL SESSION **3 - 5 PM** AT PARKLAND HIGH SCHOOL
OR VIRTUAL EVENING SESSION **6:30 - 8:30 PM**

The course will consist of 10 two-hour sessions, five for each of the verbal and math components of the SAT exam. Students may register for one SAT prep session: either an after-school session (3 - 5 PM) at PHS or a virtual evening session (6:30 - 8:30 PM).

Important information about the course:

- ◇ The 10-class session course will begin on Wednesday, September 20, 2023 and continue through Wednesday, November 1, 2023.
- ◇ Classes will be held Mondays and Wednesdays.
- ◇ Students will have a choice of an after-school session from 3 - 5 PM **or** a virtual evening session from 6:30 - 8:30 PM as seen in the schedule on the right. In the interest of scheduling, students may **only** select one session, after-school or evening, and may not combine after-school and evening sessions.
- ◇ **The cost for the 10-class session is \$90** to cover class materials. Checks should be made payable to Parkland School District. Please mail the check to Parkland High School, attention Mrs. McLeod or drop off your payment in the designated wall-mounted drop box in the lobby near the Main Office.
- ◇ Course registration opens **Wednesday, August 30, 2023.** Registration closes **Friday, September 15, 2023 at 3PM.** **Registration is on a first-to-sign-up, first-to-pay basis only, so register early as space is limited.**
- ◇ The course textbook will be available for students who have completed the online registration AND whose payment has been received. The book is theirs to keep. Fully registered students will receive confirmation of their registration and information about textbook distribution via e-mail.
- ◇ Once a student receives their SAT Prep Book, the \$90 fee is non-refundable.

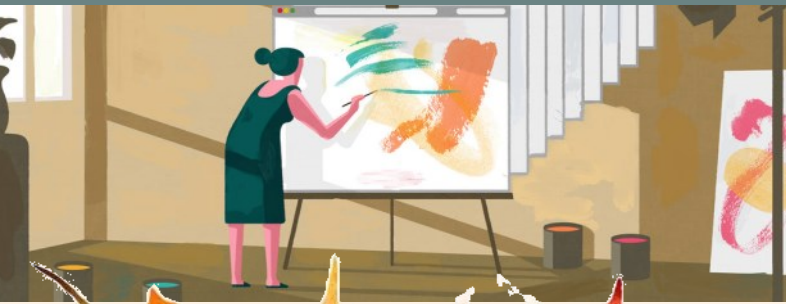

NEW IMPACT TEST REQUIREMENTS FOR JUNIORS AND SENIORS

St. Luke's is implementing new ImPACT standards starting this school year, 2023-2024.

All athletes in grade 11 and grade 12 are now required to take another ImPACT test to update their test results, even if they took the ImPACT test when they were in grade 9.

If your child is in grade 11 or grade 12, they should have taken a new ImPACT test before August 7.

All athletes entering grade 9 or who are new to the district or district sports must have an ImPACT test completed as well.

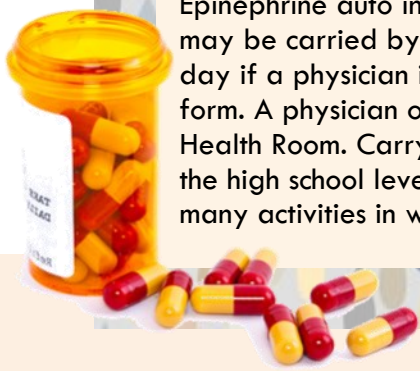
Alert about All Medication

All prescription and nonprescription medication must be brought to the school by a parent or guardian and require the following to be administered during school hours:

- ♦ a doctor's order
- ♦ completed Medication Administration Consent and Licensed Prescriber form (Find it [here](#).)

Emergency Medications

Epinephrine auto injectors and asthma inhalers may be carried by the student during the school day if a physician indicates this on the medication form. A physician order needs to be on file in the Health Room. Carrying emergency medications at the high school level is encouraged due to the many activities in which students are involved.



Juniors

Mandatory Physical

As mandated by the state of Pennsylvania, all students in grade 11 need to have a physical examination. This is best done by your family physician but may be done by the School Physician if you choose. The form for the school physical you received via email from the Health Room is the preferable paperwork to be completed. However, a PIAA High School Sport Physical or a copy of the Driver's Permit physical form may be used to complete this requirement.



Completed forms should be placed in an envelope marked "Health Room" and turned in at the Main Office or can be emailed to the Health Room [here](#). Please notify the Health Room as to how to you plan to complete this requirement.

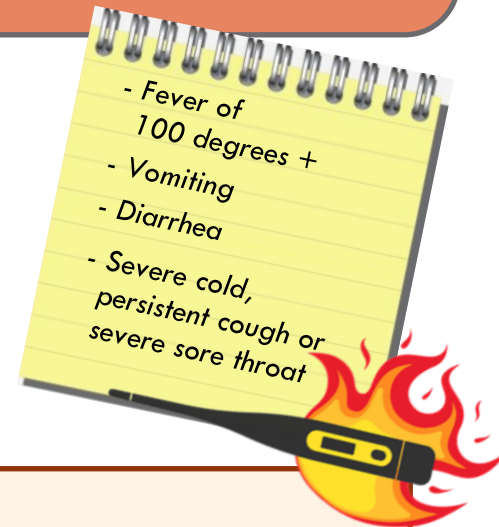
Required Immunization Deadline is **September 6, 2023**

The required immunization deadline for a second dose of meningococcal vaccine (MCV) for students in grade 12 at age 16 or older is September 6. Students need to show proof of this immunization to a school nurse on or before this date or risk exclusion.

Guidelines for Staying Healthy this School Year

If your child is experiencing the symptoms shown on the right in the morning before school, please do not send him or her to school (even if they have a test or sporting event).

It is advised that a student should be fever free for 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medications, before returning to school.



Latex Reminder

Several students at PHS have severe airborne Latex allergies.

To protect these students, PHS is a "Latex Free" environment.

Please do not send items containing Latex (like balloons) to the school.
