COLLEEN GALLOWAY '77

Colleen Galloway '77 has seen many changes to Moreau Catholic from her time as a student to her role now as principal. She shares: "The impact those students [who receive tuition assistance] have on our community, not just the gifts that they bring and the different perspectives they bring, but then that allows and sometimes challenges everybody else in the community to see the power and value of diversity. It's not just acceptance. We see the strength in it. We see how it adds to the fuller picture. Then I think that allows our students and our adults to experience people from different backgrounds. Different in all areas... And that allows them to understand the best way to find common ground... As an administrator, that's a little bit of a rush knowing that we're giving these students an opportunity that they wouldn't have had. It's not about saving them, they don't need saving. But giving them an opportunity and then all of the other options because of the Moreau education. It feels really good."



KRISTIN HANNON '02

ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL OF INSTRUCTION

Kristin (Graham) '02 and her husband, Kendal Hannon '02, come from a family tradition of Mariner education. Their grandparents sent 19 of their children through Moreau Catholic. "That was a big sacrifice," she shares, "but they really believed strongly [in giving] their kids a Catholic and high-quality education." Hannon, who personally benefited from the Br. Gary Stone, C.S.C. scholarship while attending Moreau Catholic, supports two scholarships created in honor of her in-laws: the Hannon Family Band Scholarship and the William and Monica Hannon Memorial Scholarship.

As A.P. of Instruction, she sees the daily impact of such donations on students:

"We're continuing to...make Moreau accessible to more students who otherwise would not have an opportunity to come here. That's life-changing, that's trajectory changing for people who might get lost in a big school. Students who might not be pushed to their full potential are seen here, are given opportunities here to grow in leadership skills here in ways that they might not otherwise be able to, then have more college options and career options open up to them as a result. That's incredibly impactful. Donations also allow us to give our students access to learning tools that they otherwise might not get, like robotics and lab supplies for science, and opportunities for field trips to get outside of the school and see things and be hands-on. Your gifts here make a real impact on students. They will be used in our student programs, and students will benefit from them directly."

"This year's student fundraiser enabled us to upgrade more than anticipated. We purchased two new JVC studio cameras and the latest switching system—the cornerstone of our live production—from Broadcast Pix, which features more professional quality elements and an enhanced streaming platform. The cameras provide us with the most up-to-date picture quality and output versatility.

I have had many students major in broadcast production in college and report back that they seamlessly transitioned to those studio setups because we set them up well to continue their learning at the next level.

We've aired over 500 MCTV shows since 2007, and it is important that we keep our community engaged in what we are producing. The investment in new equipment helps us to do that."


