## COMMUNITY

Our school is located 60 miles west of Louisville, an area known for its deeply-rooted agricultural heritage. There is very little industry in our area, and most parents work for the local school system, at the local hospital, or must drive a significant distance (typically one hour) for a job that pays enough to support themselves and their families. Though our students lack availability of out-of-school learning opportunities, like museums, concerts, and plays, they are rich in in-school learning opportunities.

There are currently 882 students in grades 9-12 at BCHS. The vast majority of our students are Caucasian (90.7%), and 5.56% of our students are minority (the remaining 3.74% identify as student of more than one race). All students in our district are currently receiving free breakfast and lunch.

## CURRICULUM

We pride ourselves in differentiating our curriculum to meet the needs of every student. There are certainly graduation requirements that students must meet, but our school also puts a major focus on offering an unlimited number of dual-credit courses through various colleges, Advanced Placement courses, and dual-enrollment courses as they are requested or needed. Additionally, we have students who begin taking high school level classes prior to high school, which means they complete graduation requirements before their peers. We do still, however, provide additional math and English courses to 12th graders who have met these high standards.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 4 credits of Math—must include Algebra I, Geometry, and two additional upper-level math courses
- 4 credits of English

- 1/2 credit of Health
- 1 credit of Arts/Humanities

## CLASS RANK

Class rank is computed using weighted quality points. Any course designated as "Honors" is worth 0.5 quality points more than unweighted courses and any course designated as "Advanced Placement" or "Dual Credit" are worth 1.0 quality points more than unweighted courses. Grades of all subjects for each completed grades are included in the ranking procedure. Grade Point Averages and class ranks do not change until final grades are posted, which only occurs once per year.
