OCCUPATION PROFILE

Teaching as a Profession includes several career options such as: Librarian, elementary school teachers, secondary teachers, middle school teachers and education administrators. High school teachers teach academic lessons and various skills students will need to attend college. Elementary school teachers instruct young students in basic subjects to prepare them for future schooling. Middle school teachers educate students, typically in sixth though eighth grades. Lastly, Education administrators oversee all school operations, including daily school activities.
