Foster Care Liaison

LWISD will make available the following services to homeless/foster students in the district:

- 1) Equal access to the same free, appropriate public education, including a public preschool education, as provided to other children and youths.
- 2) Services to meet the compulsory residency requirement through free bus service, one-on-one pick-up at places of temporary shelter, home visits, free breakfast/lunch program, and so forth.
- 3) Mainstream class opportunities to meet students' educational needs, as well as any other services deemed necessary through ARD, 504, or LPAC committees. Additional help for students to apply for post-secondary schools and scholarship opportunities.
- 4) Tutoring opportunities before or after school, as well as during school, to ensure students develop the necessary skills to be successful on STAAR, STAAR EOC, STAAR Spanish (grades 3-5), or STAAR ALT 2 academic achievement assessments and meet the same challenging State academic content and student academic achievement standards as all children are expected to meet.

Additional resources will also be utilized through the Communities In Schools social workers available on each school campus within LWISD.
