
MPESD Annual Bond Program Report 2019-2020 & 2020-2021

Introduction

The Mount Pleasant Elementary School District has been serving the children and families in the neighborhoods of District 5 and 8 since 1865. We currently serve 1,920 students in five schools and one District Office with grades spanning from preschool to eighth grade. We provide services and programs in STEAM* education, VAPA**, Special Education, Dual-Immersion (English/Spanish), and AVID***. Our schools are:

- Robert Sanders Elementary
- August Boeger Middle School
- Ida Jew Academy
- Valle Vista Elementary

Bond Fund Audits

On June 30, 2020 Crowe LLP, an independent auditor, performed an analysis of Bond Measure JJ (click <u>here</u>) and stated the following:

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Mount Pleasant Elementary school District's Measure JJ General Obligation Bonds as of June 30, 2020, and the changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The same statement is provided for Measure L General Obligation Bonds. You can read the entire audit <u>here</u>.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Mount Pleasant Elementary school District's Measure L General Obligation Bonds as of June 30, 2020, and the changes in financial position for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Both of these audits were presented to the Board of Trustees of the Mount Pleasant Elementary School District on January 13, 2021.

Community Input

During the last meeting in November/December 2020, attendees were presented with the priorities established by the previous community meetings and asked to rank the priorities using a survey. Attendees were given the opportunity to add an item to the existing list. Below is a summary of the school's community list of priorities (* denotes same ranking).



- Replace cafeteria flooring \$36,000* and Enlarge work and staff room \$700,000*
- Repair and widen concrete walkways around campus \$150,000
- Install classroom walls and Replace all carpet \$2,500,000

In the election conducted on November 3, 2020, voters approved the issuance of \$12,000,000 General Obligation Bonds ("Measure Q"). During the January 13, 2021 Board of Trustees meeting approved for Bond Measure Q to be under the oversight of the current CBOC.
