It has been so helpful and encouraging having a parent educator that cares for the well-being of my child and who has helped me understand the developmental milestones. I have also been reassured when I had behavioral concerns with my little one and given advice on how to handle it.

The thing that helped our family the most was the program helping us to connect with other families.

Having someone that can confirm (or not) that my child is on a normal developmental path.

All the resources and having consistent meetings to have questions answered.

Assessing developmental milestones - knowing where my child is and what to look for developmentally.

Strategies for feeding, sleep training, toileting, and general play/learning.

The home visits each month with our parent educator have been great. It feels like a great little check in with benchmarks that helps me feel like I'm doing alright at this parenting thing. She's very encouraging. I also love the play center at the Broadmoor location. We have connected with other families and there is such a great variety of toys. My son also gets to use art supplies that I haven't been brave enough to attempt at home.

We are now finished with the program and had the best experience. Our parent educator was a godsend, and we will forever be thankful for her. Her kindness, compassion, expertise, warmth and just overall calmness was so helpful to me as I became a new mom, through the infant stage, and then trying to learn about and survive the toddler years. She was great with my son and even great with our dog! She truly is the best and provided us with invaluable experience.
