**Budget Adjustment**

On September 1, 2021, Tropical Storm IDA impacted the district. As a result, a number of unbudgeted expenditures to repair the damage caused by IDA in the High School, Middle School and Landing School buildings were required for student and staff to occupy these buildings. Some of these expenditures have already been made with the use of budgetary funds and, in doing so, have depleted the funds in certain budget codes. FEMA has accepted the District's application for funding and will cover 90% of the damages that were incurred due to IDA. In order to obtain these funds from FEMA, the District will need to pay for the repair of these damages and, when all documentation has been submitted to FEMA, reimbursement to the District will be made by FEMA.

It is recommended that the following budget adjustment be made, increasing the 2021-2022 budget by \$1,671,806.
