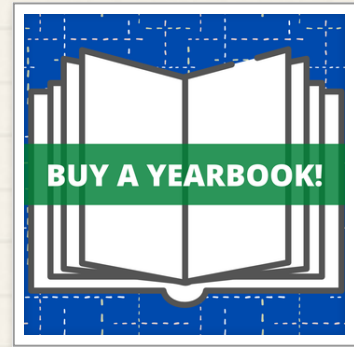

Mariners Grand Slam Camps

Drowning is Preventable
It can happen in seconds and is often silent

Drowning is the second leading cause of unintentional injury death for children ages 1 to 14 years, and the fifth leading cause for people of all ages. Most children ages 1 to 4 die from drowning but any other cause of death except birth defects.

5 things you can do to prevent drowning!

1. Assign an adult to consistently watch children around water. Stay sober, reach and do not get distracted.
2. Learn to float. Learn basic swimming skills. Never swim alone.
3. Wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) on every open water swim, on crafts, and on boats. Some PFDs come with an auto-inflatable feature. If you don't own one, consider buying one and attaching it to the boat.
4. Reach across to water. Ensure multiple barriers are in place around backyard pools.
5. Learn CPR with rescue breaths.

Rip currents are powerful, narrow channels of water moving in the offshore direction. This can occur along any coastline with breaking waves, and are prevalent along most U.S. coastlines. A rip current pulls swimmers away from the shore into deeper water; it does not pull you under. Jumping and trying to swim against the rip current's surge will pull you under. Rip currents account for over 50% of rescues performed by surf beach lifeguards. The United States Coast Guard estimates that more than 100 people die each year due to rip currents on our nation's beaches.

What do you do if you are ever caught in water above your head?

THE FLOTT and FLOTTAGE!
The most important thing to remember when drowning is to stay calm; panicking will cause you to drown faster!

1. FLOTT and FLOTTAGE!
2. FLOTT to keep your head above water, calm yourself, and conserve energy. Floating is the most important swimming skill to know.
3. FLOTTAGE is a safe path out of the water. Olympic swimmers cannot swim without splashing or kicking, neither can you - don't try to tread, follow the current to figure out which way is floating. Then, if you have the energy, swim **PERPENDICULAR TO THE CURRENT** - get out. Once you are out, the waves may help bring you ashore. If you become too exhausted to swim, continue to float and try to signal for help. Use an oar/floatline available to bring attention to yourself!

FLIP, FLOTT, and FLOTTAGE will be even easier and more effective if you are wearing a U.S. Coast Guard approved PFD. Wearing brightly colored swimwear and PFDs will also make it easier to be seen by rescuers.

Water wings, pool noodles, and inflatable toys, not safety devices. Do not rely on them to keep your child safe in the water.

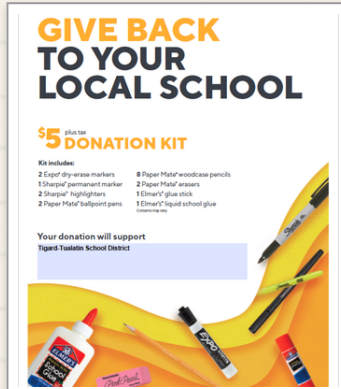
