Drowning is Preventable
It can happen in seconds and is often silent

Drowning is the second leading cause of unintentional injury death for children ages 1 to 14 years, and the fifth leading cause for people of all ages. More children ages 1-4 die from drowning than any other cause of death except bad traffic.

5 things you can do to prevent drowning:

1. Assign an adult to consistently watch children around water. Stay in arm's reach and do not get distracted.
2. Learn to float. Learn basic swimming skills. Never swim alone.
3. Wear a US Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) (life vest) in and around open water, on boats, and on rivers. Some PFDs come with an auto-inflation device. If your device is inflatable, consider having one and attaching it to the wall.
4. Back away from water. Encourage multiple barriers on a pool around backyard pools.
5. Learn CPR with rescue breaths.

Rip currents are powerful, narrow channels of water moving in the offshore direction. They can occur along the coastline with breaking waves, and are present even around U.S. lifelines. A rip current pulls swimmers away from the shore into deeper water; it does not pull swimmers "parallel and trying to swim against the rip current" which will get you under. Rip currents account for over 80% of rescues performed by surf beach lifeguards. The United States Lifeguard Association estimates that more than 300 people die each year due to rip currents on our nation's beaches.

What do you do if you are ever caught in water above your head?

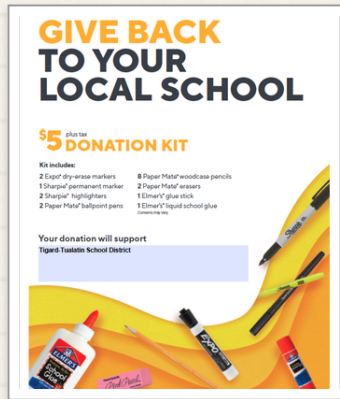
