Red Bank Catholic High School is accredited by the AdvancED Accreditation Commission. Additionally, as a parochial high school, the Diocese of Trenton directs the Implementation of the educational program.

The college preparatory curriculum of our four-year parochial high school is diverse and student-centered. Strong emphasis is placed upon the importance of basics in a traditional college preparatory program. Approximately 700 students attend Red Bank Catholic with 172 enrolled in the 2023/2024 senior class.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of 130 credits is required for graduation and must include the following:
Four years of Religion and English;
Three years of Mathematics and Science;
Two years of United States History, World Language and Physical Education (CPR included in 11th grade PE)
One year of World History and Fine/Practical/Performing Arts
One-quarter of Health, one quarter of Leadership, and one quarter of Drivers Education
*One quarter year Physical Education (requirement grade 9)

GPA/CLASS RANK

Our 4.0 G.P.A. is weighted according to the difficulty level of the course taken. It is therefore possible for a significant number of students in a class to have a G.P.A. which exceeds 4.0. Reporting of class rank on student transcripts is optional.

90.1% of the class of 2023 enrolled in four-year colleges or universities; 6.2% went on to two-year colleges.

STANDARDIZED TEST SCORES

Cognitive Abilities Test – Given in the fall of grade 9. Reports natural ability in verbal-quantitative, and non-verbal area. Used for class placement.

IOWA – Given in spring in grades 9 and 10. Reports level of achievement in English Language and Math. Used for class placement and assessment of progress.

PSAT – Given in October, grade 10 and 11. Practice SAT. Report gives score, number correct in each area (verbal and math), individual items wrong and correct answers for them. Results should be used to prepare for SAT. National Merit Competition determined by junior PSAT scores.

SAT – Required by most colleges for admission or placement. Some colleges require Subject Tests available in 24 subjects (given on the same national test dates except March).

ACT- American College Testing Program is an alternative admission test for many colleges.

The Guidance staff provides support and encouragement for students as they learn to adjust to new situations and face both personal and academic challenges.
