

Board Policy 6158: Independent study is a voluntary alternative learning environment. Students must be offered classroom-based instruction first. A student that is referred as a result of a suspension or expulsion may participate only if it is voluntary. No student may be required to participate. Participation must be approved by all participants through a learning agreement. Parents/Guardians may request a conference to discuss educational options prior to enrollment. Students must meet residency and age requirements, including an interdistrict transfer when applicable. If a student is 19-21 years of age, they must have been continuously enrolled in school since their 18th birthday with no gaps in enrollment. Students that qualify for home and hospital are not eligible for course-based independent study. All students must meet immunization requirements. Students with an IEP (individualized education plan) must have an offer of FAPE (free appropriate public education) for independent study. All students will have the equal rights and privileges of students in the regular school program.

All courses are certified to be equal in quality, quantity, and rigor of in-person classes. Courses reflect the SBCUSD (San Bernardino City Unified School District) Board adopted curriculum and are aligned to local and state standards. Students will receive the equivalent instructional minutes as classroom-based instruction, unless otherwise permitted by law.

All students must make SEP (satisfactory educational progress) to remain in independent study. Tiered re-engagement strategies will be utilized and an evaluation shall be conducted to determine whether it is in the student's best interest to remain in independent study whenever the student fails to make satisfactory educational progress or is in violation of their learning/supplemental agreements.

School Calendar/Schedules: School days, minimum days, exam days, holidays, and vacation days are identified in the SBCUSD school year calendar.





Objectives:

- All courses will address the California state standards within their subject area using the SBCUSD adopted curriculum.
- Lesson objectives will be provided by the classroom teacher during instruction or through the LMS (learning management system) such as Google Classroom, Edmentum, APEX, etc.

Methods of Study: Classes will be conducted through a Google Meet or Zoom. These links are available through the student's Google Classrooms. Students will be required to have their cameras on with their entire face showing during synchronous instruction, live interaction, small groups, assessments, and 1-on-1 meetings. Students are required to complete their asynchronous work.

Participation/Engagement:

Participation and engagement will be documented through AERIES. Parents must have an AERIES parent portal and agree to receive emergency/general notifications in AERIES. Parents will receive daily notifications through AERIES for an absence if their child is not participating/engaging.

Grades 9-12 ONLY:

- Students that are on pace (no missing or late assignments/assessments) and have a C or higher in every class will only be required to attend period 0 (Advisory), and their regularly scheduled weekly 1-on-1 meeting with their supervising teacher. These students can attend periods 1-4 as needed for academic support.
- Students that are off pace (have missing or late assignments/assessments), have a D or F in any class, or are not making progress towards IEP goals (if applicable), will be required to attend period 0 (Advisory), their regularly scheduled weekly 1-on-1 meeting with their supervising teacher, and any period that they are off pace or have a D or F in.

I understand that I am responsible for ensuring my child has their camera on with their entire face visible and completes all asynchronous (independent) work. I agree to receiving general and

emergency notifications and that when I receive an automated call about attendance, it is referring to my child's participation and engagement.



Manner/Time/Frequency/Place:

All classroom assignments and assessments will be assigned/submitted virtually through the LMS. Synchronous and asynchronous work must be completed and turned in by the due date. Due dates are assigned by the classroom teacher and are located within the LMS. Acceptance of late work is at the discretion of the teacher, however, the maximum length of time between when the assignments are made and the date by which they must turn in the assigned work cannot exceed more than 20 consecutive school days. If extenuating circumstances exist, the school administrators may allow for a longer period of time between the date an assignment is made and when it is due. In no event, shall the due date of an assignment be extended beyond the end of the grading period or the termination date of the agreement, whichever comes first.

Physical Education Requirements:

Students in grades 1-5 and any other student enrolled in a PE (physical education) course, is required to complete and submit a bi-weekly physical education log to their classroom teacher. The PE log must be signed by both the parent and the student. These logs will record the date, activity, intensity, and duration of their physical activity. The time spent in their PE class counts as physical activity and should be recorded on the log. Students are required to document the following amount of time each week on their PE log:


- Grades 1-5: 100 minutes per week of physical activity
- Grades 6-12: 200 minutes per week of physical activity

Satisfactory Educational Progress: SEP is determined by the student's achievement of standards; participation/engagement; completion of assignments, assessments, or other indicators; learning of required concepts; and progress towards the successful completion of the course(s) of study. A program review shall be conducted whenever the student does the following in one or more courses:

- does not make progress towards the state and local standards
- does not participate/engage in synchronous/live instruction for 3 school days in a week or 50% of the school days in a month



- does not complete assignments, assessments, or other indicators for 3 school days in a week or 10% of the instructional time in a month
- Is missing 4 or more assignments/assessments
- violates their learning/supplemental agreements

When a student is at-risk of not making SEP, tiered re-engagement strategies will be used. These strategies may include but are not limited to:

- verification of contact information
- parent/guardian notification
- address technology needs
- home visit
- parent-teacher conference
- outside referrals
- returning the student to in-person learning

If it is determined that a student is not making satisfactory educational progress through tiered re-engagement or if a parent wishes to return their child to in-person instruction, the school shall develop a plan to return the child to in-person learning within 5 instructional days.

In the event that establishing services or supports within an IEP will result in exceeding this 5 day turnaround, the child will be immediately returned to in-person learning or once those supports or services are in place.

Supplemental Agreements:

Additional supplemental agreements may be added throughout the duration of this agreement and will be considered part of this agreement. These include but are not limited to: student/parent handbook, course syllabi (grades 6-12), IEPs, 504 Plans, program reviews, addendums, Online Code of Conduct, etc.
