## INSTRUCTION

## Class Size

The District will strive to achieve ratios consistent with the State class size recommendations. When a class size exceeds the following numbers of students, then the class shall constitute a hardship to the District in accepting out-of-district students. The enrollment of a student from another District or attendance zone shall also be deemed to constitute a hardship if it would require the hiring of additional staff, the provision of educational services not currently provided in the school, or the overcrowding of existing classes or cause an excessive number of students in a particular building.

All classroom sizes shall be reported to the Board four (4) times a year.
*Consideration shall be given for the needs of special education students when addressing the class size ratio and an overcrowded class situation.*
