Amherst Exempted Village School District has a senior high (9-12), a junior high (6-8), a middle school (3-5), and an elementary school (PreK-2). The district's enrollment is 3,721 students with approximately 1,777 at Marion L. Steele High School.

Amherst is located in Lorain County in the northern part of Ohio. Lake Erie is just a few miles to the north. Cleveland is 25 miles to the east. Toledo is 90 miles to the west, and Columbus is 110 miles to the south. The city's population is approximately 12,108.




