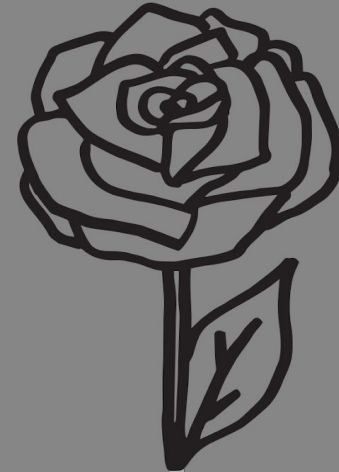

# Proposal Ideas...

Sketch drawn overtop provided image, with reference visulas included to showcase similar approaches.

There are (2) layout options for you to choose from. Both have the plaques attached to the brick or concrete on the ground surrounding the central garden area.

One student drew the rose (Anna Wunderlich), while another (McKayla Shelly) translated it into (2) B/W versions.

These were converted into vector drawings so they can be brought into the CNC program to cut out of decided material.

TSA Club to begin engraving and/or cutting out samples of plaques.

Interact Club to look into pricing of benches, brick for circular memorial, mulch, shrubs, flowers, ground lights.

# Timeline...

## Due by Monday, 11.4.19

- **TSA and/or MAT 1 and/or MAT 2 class**
  - Demo (sample) of plaque. Two options: 2D Rose with student 'name' and student 'dates' engraved OR traditional plaque with name, dates and rose engraved into rectangular plaque.
- **NAHS**
  - Sketch of the space from picture sent of grounds on D.O. where the student memorial will be erected.
    - This is a rough sketch of ideas. Shrubs, plants, ground lights, benches and memorial that plaques will be attached to.
  - Sketch of 2D flower with name and dates engraved for option 1
  - Traditional rectangular plaque with name, dates and rose engraved.

## • Due by April, 2020

- Final sketch of grounds
- Final plaque of the rose or rectangular with name and dates; whichever is decided.
  - All made of students being remembered.

## • To be completed in late April/Early May

- **Interact Club** – Mini Going Beyond Day
  - Students will Mulch, plant flowers, place benches, lights and 'adhere' plaques to memorial 'stand'.
  - Moving forward this will become a Going Beyond project to maintain the grounds.
