In case of a bus accident, a district Representative will inform parent of:

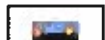
- Evacuation of students to a safe Location if necessary.

For this reason, emergency procedures have been established to protect staff and students during a crisis or natural disaster.

How Can We Make Schools A Safe Place For Children?

The primary cause of anxiety for many parents today is protecting your children from acts of violence at school. In general, parents and school officials are concerned about preventing children from becoming either aggressors or victims. This brochure discusses what steps parents and school administrators can take to make schools safer during a crisis.

SAFETY/SECURITY TIPS

- Please make sure to sign in with the office. This will help to assure that no unauthorized visitors are in the building at any time.
- Teachers and staff members will report unfamiliar visitors to office immediately.



EARLY DISMISSAL

- Early dismissal may be used after a bomb threat or if inclement weather is coming.

LATE START OR SCHOOL CLOSING

- The district superintendent will determine the dismissal or late start of school.
- Please do not assume that schools will be closed.
- Watch the following TV stations or listen to the radio broadcasts for information in the event that bad weather or other emergencies are creating a need to close schools. School will resume when the emergency is under control.
- In the event of a natural disaster during school hours, please call the school office at 361-998-2214 (High School) 361-998-2335 (Elementary) and 361-998-2542 (Administration) to find out further details related to the specific emergency. A designated campus staff member will be able to inform you of specific pickup procedures.

EVACUATION OF STUDENTS

- In the case of an emergency, such as a fire/explosion, bomb threat, chemical spill, etc., your child may be evacuated to a safe place.
- Call the office to find out specific detail on the procedures to pick up your child. If the site-based campus is unavailable, call the Administration Office at 361-998-2542 for more details.

RETENTION OF STUDENTS

An emergency may prevent the safe evacuation of staff and students, which will require a lock down of the campus.

LOCKDOWN

- A lockdown will be initiated if there is a possible intruder, violence incident or a major car accident outside the school.
- 911 or other emergency services will be contacted immediately during the onset of an crisis.
- Please do NOT try to contact your student or come near the premises.
- It is imperative to stay calm during a crisis.
- Staff and students will remain in lock down until the crisis is under control.

SHELTER IN PLACE

- If there is a tornado warning or flash flood, we will keep students inside. This may result in a late dismissal.
- We encourage you to come inside where we will have a safe place for you.

Remember that school is one of the safest places for students and adults to be during most crisis situation or natural disasters. We want to do all we can to protect and support your family and our community if a crisis occurs.
