2022-2023 School Year

NJGPA ASSESSMENT

- Statute requires the State graduation proficiency assessment to **administered to all grade 11 students** (N.J.S.A. 18A:7C-6)
- NJGPA is designed to measure the extent to which students are graduation ready in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics
- Graduation readiness is reported separately for each content component
- The ELA component is aligned to the grade 10 standards
- The Mathematics component is aligned to Algebra I and Geometry standards



GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

On May 3, 2023, the New Jersey State Board of Education adopted the proficiency level cut score for the English language Arts (ELA) and mathematics components of the NJGPA, as well as the menu of alternative assessments and aligned cut scores

Students who take but do not meet the minimum required score on each component of the assessment will have the opportunity to receive additional supports and may take the following steps:

- Retake the ELA and/or mathematics components of the New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment in the following summer or fall;
- Meet a designated cut score from the menu of substitute competency tests;
- Complete a portfolio appeal (after exhausting the previous two options)







2022-23 NJGPA by Subgroup Gender



 - Are beginning the portfolio process

 - For ELA: Evidence-Based Responses
 - For Math: Geometry and Modeling and Reasoning

2022-2023 School Year

WHAT IS ACCESS TESTING?

- State required assessment in the four skills (reading, writing, speaking and listening) for students in ESL
- Mostly administered online
- All Multilingual Learners, even those who have declined services and those who have just arrived, must sit for ACCESS
- Teachers use multiple measures including a state mandated cut off score (4.5 of 6) to determine if students exit from or remain in the program









ACCESS: AREAS OF STRENGTH AND AREAS FOR GROWTH

Areas of Strength:

- Small group instruction
- Strong co-teaching in ELA at the middle school
- Strong administrative support at high school
- Expanding course offerings at the high school
- Trained additional staff in SIOP model

Areas for Growth:

- Need to expand in-class supports for ELLs at middle school
- Increase outside of school day supports for ELLs
- Set up ongoing parental support groups for under-resourced families


Continue SIOP training for PPS general education staff; provide additional PD on best practices
