



EXTERNAL INTERNSHIP SPOTLIGHT - MAJDA NOKOUR 25'





The month May is one of the busiest months for volunteer background checks as many of the schools in the district are going on field trips and need background checks for volunteer chaperones. As such, here are some reminders to share with others in your area.

- All volunteers must have a current (within the last three years) volunteer background check with the district. If a volunteer is an FWCS employee, they do not need to do a volunteer background check.
- If a chaperone will be responsible for students without an FWCS employee present, the chaperone will need a comprehensive volunteer background check, even if they recently completed a limited background check.
- Background checks take 5-15 business days to complete (that is 1-3 weeks!).
 Therefore, it is necessary to have your volunteers complete their background check as soon as possible.
- Potential volunteers should call the Community Programs main line at 260-467-8810. Any one of the Community Programs staff members can help callers.

We do have the ability to work with individuals who may need an interpreter. Callers can either call the Multilingual Info Line at (260) 467-2009 and ask to speak with Community Programs, or call Community Programs and we will conference call the Multilingual Info Line. 
