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What is PBIS?

Positive Behavior and Interventions and Supports system is a school wide approach to discipline and a process for creating safe and more effective schools. The process focuses on improving a school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students by developing a research- based, school wide acknowledgement system to follow.

The Four R's

Respect: Show manners and treat others with kindness

Responsibility: Be responsible for your own actions and choices

Right Choices: Make smart, positive choices

Readiness: Be prepared and ready to work and learn

What You Do at Home to Encourage Cougar Pride

- Be familiar with our behavior matrix
- Review behavior expectations with your child
- Use the four R's (**Respect, Responsibility, Right Choices, and Readiness**)
- Give positive acknowledgements (for example: acknowledge your child for making good choices)
- Remember 5 Positives to 1 Negative
- Volunteer your time to help with
- PBIS events
- Donate items that could be used for the Cougar tickets drawing



Why PBIS at Centerville?
