Dear Parents/Guardians,

Innovations International Charter School of Nevada is working to provide rigorous academic courses for our students. The school's program is fully accredited by Cognia. At the high school level, students are able to express an interest and ask to be placed in Honors classes to help with the College and Career Readiness diploma upon graduation. Beginning this academic year, we are also offering dual credit classes with the College of Southern Nevada for the juniors and seniors. Students entering high school taking Honors classes will be better prepared for the dual credit classes as they experience expectations similar to those presented to college level courses. We are very excited to have your students participate in these classes.

Teachers offering Honors classes are committed to challenging students to adequately prepare them for college-level courses that are more challenging than regular courses. Classes may require additional reading, research, essays, projects, and class presentations. Curriculum may be presented at a faster pace and have a greater depth of complexity for Honors classes. This may be challenging for some students, so Innovations will be able to tutor students as needed to help them adjust and create spectacular study skills.

Upon acceptance to an Honors class, students are expected to:

1. Maintain high academic achievement and intellectual ability
2. Be self-motivating and show self-discipline in school
3. Have good organizational skills
4. Exhibit excellent written and spoken expression skills
5. Be an avid reader of all kinds of text
6. Complete all in-class guided practice, complete and submit assigned work, and study for exams
7. Maintain an A/B grade in all Honors classes for the school year
8. Remain in the Honors class for a full academic school year
9. Maintain high standards of academic integrity
10. Exhibit leadership skills
11. Be in class every day. Excessive absences may be grounds for removal from the Honors class back to a general education class. Excessive tardies, absences, and disruptive issues will also not be tolerated.
12. Uphold the school's Honor Code regarding plagiarism, cheating, and submitting work he/she did not complete.
13. Remember that student success is the ultimate goal, but students not succeeding in an Honors class will be handled on an individual basis.
