Construction

John Mills and Elmwood Elementary Schools are wrapping up construction that includes a full renovation of the schools. New classroom furniture will also be installed prior to the start of the school year. Thank you for your continued patience and support of this multi-year project!

EPHS has its own construction project in the works. The Large Group Instruction (LGI) room on the first floor and the library on the second floor are seeing major changes including new classrooms, breakout spaces, bathrooms, an updated media center and multiple offices.

Construction at Elmwood Elementary has been ongoing since Spring of 2022 and is on schedule to be mostly completed this summer with smaller tasks being worked on throughout the next year.

As of late July, each classroom and additional collaboration spaces were renovated. Painting and flooring will be complete before school starts and new furniture will be installed.

Completion for the projects at John Mills is on a similar trajectory. As of late July, demolition of the remaining renovation areas is complete and framing for the new technology, music and art classrooms has begun.

A more robust attendance system will require older students to scan their ID cards to gain entry to the building. Those students, as well as all staff, will also be required to have their ID's visible at all times.




Mr. Frank Kuzniewski
