Benchmark English Language Arts And Social Studies



Benchmark Advance is our district adopted ELA curriculum

- Benchmark is a balanced literacy approach to ELA
 - Balanced Literacy has five components:
 - Read Aloud
 - Shared Reading
 - Reading Mini Lesson (Mentor Read)
 - Independent Reading
 - Social Studies curriculum is also embedded in the Benchmark units
- Daily lessons include whole group and small group instruction













Foundational Skills

PAF is a multisensory phonics-based program in which reading, spelling, and handwriting are taught as one unified lesson. It's a beginning reading program that meets the needs of all children, including those at risk for reading failure, and offers instructional techniques based on the latest scientific research.

PAF Program Implementation

PAF will be implemented as a Tier I reading program by kindergarten teachers. PAF lessons will be delivered a minimum of 45 minutes a day, 5 days a week.

Tier 1 instruction for the whole class by the classroom teacher.







Learning and Working Now and Long Ago

- Students understand that being a good citizen involves acting in certain ways.
- Students compare and contrast the locations of people, places, and environments and describe their characteristics.
 Maps, symbols and relative location near or far
- Students understand that history relates to events, people, and places of other times.

Kindergarten mathematics is about:

- Representing, relating, and operating on whole numbers, initially with sets of objects
- 2. Describing shapes and space


More learning time in Kindergarten should be devoted to numbers than to other topics.



Module Phenomenon: How can I protect the environment from changes that harm it?





Bell Schedule for Kindergarten

- Student Supervision on Yard/Gates open 8:00
- Kindergarten hours: 8:20-1:00
- Minimum Day Schedule: 8:20-12:30 (Wednesdays)
- Kindergarten students will have recess/brunch 10:00-10:25
- Students who ride the bus will have lunch on campus before boarding the bus
- Inclusion students who are taking the bus will board the bus at 1:00pm (12:30 on Wednesdays)







Your child will need a snack every day. Please remember that the students will have about 15 minutes to eat during our morning break. With this in mind, please try to pack a reasonable amount of food for the morning snack. Water and two food items seem to be an appropriate amount. Healthy food and snack choices are encouraged.



Supplies

We have taken care of the supplies needed for each student. Each student have his/her own toolbox for the storage of the supplies. Throughout the year, we will most likely need to reach out to the families to restock some of the supplies.

Dress Code




We ask that your child is always appropriately dressed for school. Please remember that all students need to wear running shoes for P.E.

We are asking that you and your child practice reading for 15 minutes per day in addition to going to ST Math and Footsteps2Brilliance.

Chromebooks will be sent home daily and are expected to be brought back and forth to school. Please make sure that they are fully charged.



Birthdays



Meadow Heights has a specific policy regarding birthday celebrations. Food items are not allowed. Please do not send in any food items for your child's big day. A special birthday crown, pencil and sticker will be given to the birthday child to help celebrate the day.

If you wish to send in goodie bags, please make sure that they do not contain any food items and there are enough bags for all students.

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If your child has strep throat or another bacterial infection, he/she should stay home until the antibiotic has been given for at least 24 hours and your health care provider has given permission for your child to return to school. We encourage you to seek medical attention when your child is sick and to follow your health care provider's recommendations about returning to school and other activities.
