ACCUPLACER VIRTUAL TESTING

All graduating students for the school year 2023-2024 will need to complete the virtual ACCUPLACER testing. This test assesses a student's post-secondary readiness skills in reading and mathematics. The data allows us to personalize a learning plan for your student to ensure they are college and career ready when they graduate. *Note if a student completed the testing during the 2022-2023 school year, they do not need to take the test again unless otherwise indicated by their scores. Students need a valid ID to complete ACCUPLACER. If your student does not have an ID, please contact **Mrs. O'Grady**.

FALL VIRTUAL NWEAS

Save the date! Grades 7-11 students will participate in the virtual NWEAs the week of September 11th. This data allows us to design a personalized learning and intervention plan for your student!

SAVE THE DATE: IN-PERSON MEA TESTING

The MEAs for Math and Reading, will be held throughout the month of October and we are currently working on reserving sites all across Maine. This assessment is administered to all students in 7th, 8th, and 10th grade. The assessment will allow us to measure student's progress towards grade-level proficiency.
