

ARTICULATION

In accordance with Board Policy IHCDA, Postsecondary Enrollment, and this regulation, Colorado Springs School District 11 (the District) may pay for Career and Technical Education articulation and certifications when such opportunities are made available through certified District programs and align to a student's postsecondary workforce readiness as identified in their Academic Plan of Study. [Note: In the District, the Academic Plan of Study is incorporated into the student's Individual Career and Academic Plan (ICAP) – see Board Policy IHBK for details regarding ICAPs].

Articulation is a program by which students earn college credit for their Career and Technical Education (CTE) course work. Articulation agreements are determined annually through a process with qualified community college partners.

QUALIFICATIONS

Students may earn articulated credit if they receive an A or a B in a CTE course that has been articulated with a postsecondary course.

Students must seek articulated credit by completing the articulation credit request form. This form is electronic and available on the District 11 Career and Technical Education website.

A student may receive credit up to three years after the completion of a course by submitting the appropriate documentation to Pikes Peak Community College (PPCC) or by completing the District articulation form.

A maximum of 6 credits may be articulated before the student is required to take a course at PPCC for a minimum of .5 credits. This course requirement may be fulfilled through Concurrent Enrollment while the student is enrolled in the District.

COST

The cost of an articulated course is \$10, regardless of credits. The District may pay this cost.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENTS

New articulation agreements may be made possible at any time throughout the school year. Eligible CTE programs, CTE instructors, the CTE Director, and PPCC shall work collaboratively to pursue new articulations regularly.

The CTE Director and the CTE instructors shall maintain existing articulations as long as the courses and programs continue to be approved by the Colorado Community College Systems.
