

## **STUDENT PERFORMANCES/EXHIBITS/COMPETITION**

1. All scheduled public performances or exhibitions must be approved by the principal prior to the performance or exhibition.
2. Students scheduled for public appearances or exhibitions will be fully aware of expected dress and conduct and in all preparations for performance.
3. Students will not be excused from their regular classes except as members of a school organization or class which has the principal's/designee's permission to prepare, rehearse or present a public performance.
4. Requests by non-school agencies for school organizations or groups to perform must be made in writing to the school principal or designee. In the case of special performances, the principal or designee should consult the director of the division involved.
5. Non-school agencies which request school organizations or groups to perform may be required to pay the expenses of moving risers, transporting students, cleaning uniforms, etc.

### **Generally-approved events**

1. Events sponsored by the schools (top priority)
2. Community events organized in the interest of schools
3. Noncommercial civic occasions of community, county, state or national interest
4. Events that are primarily patriotic
5. Charity benefit activities provided such activity has been specifically approved in advance by the school administration
6. Programs sponsored by established character-building agencies or programs sponsored jointly by the school district and media where the time and space given to the programs are of a public service nature

### **Nonapproved events**

1. Events that are for the purpose of private gain or for advertising any commercial project or product
2. Events that are for the furtherance of any politically partisan interest
3. Events that are for the furtherance of any sectarian concern
4. Events that cause an undue amount of interference with the regular school program or that cause an excessive amount of absence due to rehearsal or preparation
