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# District Accountability (DAC) Newsletter

April 2023

### Welcome

It's hard to believe April is here. Thank you for your work and dedication this school year. Now is the time to reflect and start planning for the next school year. What did your SAC accomplish this year? What are improvements that could be made? How can we provide opportunities for all families to have a voice? The answers to these questions are specific to your school community. Take a look again at the <u>Family-School Partnerships: An implementation guide</u> to consider areas where your school community can improve. Relationships and communication are keys to launching student success.

April is the month for testing. Remember that testing is only one measure of progress. Students will take the final STAR test to measure academic progress and growth. In addition, all students 3-8 will take the English language arts and math portion of the Colorado Measures of Academic Success tests. PSAT will be given in grades 9 & 10 and the SAT in grade 11, 5th, 8th, and 11th graders will take the science test. SACs should reach out to principals with questions.

The DAC and the subcommittees are continuing to work:

- The DAC learned about the Early Warning System (EWS) tool for on-track graduation. This tool allows schools to look at data in one place and then help students with interventions earlier. In addition, Steele Elementary presented their request to become the Interbaccalaurate (IB) elementary school in D11 and complete a pathway with North and Palmer.
- The DAC Accreditation Subcommittee received an update on enrollment from Melissa Andrews. She also explained the support being given to schools to help with enrollment numbers next school year.
- The DAC Budget Subcommittee provided a report of budget recommendations and questions to the Board. They will be discussing these recommendations with the Board this month.
- The Training and SAC Support Subcommittee is ready for the final SAC training scheduled on April 6th. The training will be headlined by Superintendent Gaal speaking on the strengths of the vertical area management structure and the role and functions of the Area Superintendents. The second half of the training, we will participate in breakout sessions with Area Superintendents, with the goal of getting to know the Area Superintendent for your area and understand how they can support your school.
- The DAC Charter School Review Subcommittee began reviewing the Colorado International Language Institute (CILA) charter School transfer application. Their review will go to the Board this month.

The D11 Family School Community Partnerships (FSCP) Collaborative celebrated Stratton Elementary and Adult and Family Education for their FSCP BrightSpots at the March Board meeting.

As a DAC, we want to support our School Accountability Committees. It is time to start preparing for elections for SAC Chair for next year. Ask your principal to be invited to your school One Plan symposium. If we can provide any help or support, please reach out so we can help. Once again, thank you for your partnership and dedication to launch student success.

### Summer School (Summer Bridge) plans for summer 2023:

- D11 will again provide a summer school program (Summer Bridge) in June 2023.
- Tentative plans are to provide one 4 week session (K 12) starting Monday Jun 5<sup>th</sup> and ending Friday Jun 30<sup>th</sup>. Host sites will be grouped by area.
- The schools will operate 5 days per week, provide 5.5 instructional hours per day on core academics, enrichment, social emotional learning, range of other subjects and project-based learning experiences.
- Final details are being worked out with much more information coming out in mid to late April. Check with your principal to see how your school will be participating. ### Upcoming deadlines of interest to SACs

- <u>State Tests</u>: Colorado 3-8<sup>th</sup> grade CMAS tests (ELA and Math) are scheduled in the period April 10<sup>th</sup> Apr 28<sup>th</sup>. Colorado 5<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> grade CMAS Science tests are scheduled April 10<sup>th</sup> Apr 28<sup>th</sup>. Colorado 9-10<sup>th</sup> grade PSAT tests are scheduled April 12<sup>th</sup> -27<sup>th</sup> (including make-up dates). The Colorado 11<sup>th</sup> grade SAT is April 12<sup>th</sup> with a make-up date of Apr 25<sup>th</sup>. <u>Check with your school for the specific test schedule for your school.</u>
- Acadience Reading (READ Act) EOY (end of year) tests K-3: Scheduled April 24<sup>th</sup> May 12<sup>th</sup>. Schools choose a two week window.
- District Benchmark (EOY) tests grades 3 11: Scheduled Apr 3<sup>rd</sup> April 14<sup>th</sup>.
- May 31 Jun 2, 2023: D11 One Plan Symposium for School Year 23-24 Save the Date, SACs will be invited to participate
- Election of New SAC Officers: April is the month to elect, or be thinking about election of officers for the coming school year as outlined in D11 Reg. AE-R-2, School Accountability Committees. It is also a good time to set the SAC meeting calendar for the next school year.
