Welcome

Can you believe we are in the final quarter of the school year? I have a senior, so there is a celebration of accomplishments and an excitement for the future. Thank you for your work and dedication this year. Now is the time to reflect and start planning for the next school year. What did your SAC accomplish this year? What are improvements that could be made? How can we provide opportunities for all families to have a voice? The answers to these questions are specific to your school community. The search for a new superintendent has started. Watch for opportunities to provide input for the D11 superintendent search, this may be a group meeting or answering a survey. Your input is needed and appreciated. The DAC will be providing feedback as a group for this search at our April meeting.

State testing is back to a normal schedule this year. All students 3-8 will take the English language arts and math portion of the Colorado Measures of Academic Success tests. PSAT will be given in grades 9 & 10 and the SAT in grade 11, 5th, 8th, and 11th graders will take the science test. SACs should reach out to principals with questions.

The DAC and it's Subcommittees are continuing to work:

- The DAC got an update on the Academic Master Plan. We look forward to finding out
 the schools that are chosen as pathways and to hear the finalized definition of quality
 neighborhood schools. In addition, we submitted a letter to the Board with some immediate needs to be addressed as well as initiatives in the District that need to continue.
 We are committed to provide timely input to the Board.
- The DAC Accreditation Subcommittee spent time with Karol Gates from Curriculum and Instruction discussing the work that is being done to address academic issues.
- The DAC Budget Subcommittee provided a report of budget recommendations to the Board. They will be discussing these recommendations with the Board. They will also be reviewing the ESSER III budget.
- The Training and SAC Support Subcommittee is ready for the final SAC training scheduled on April 7. The training will focus on the Summer Symposium Information and testimonials, and Chicago 5E Results. The second hour we will participate in Family Engagement Circles. SACs and school principals are strongly encouraged to attend.

If you haven't already, please plan on attending one of the remaining Family Engagement community events on April 25 at the East Library or on May 10 at Penrose Library. We want to hear your voice.

Upcoming deadlines of interest to SACs

<u>State Tests</u>: Colorado 3-8th grade CMAS tests (the full spectrum) are scheduled in the period April 11th – Apr 29th. Colorado 9-10th grade PSAT tests are scheduled April 13th -28th (including make-up dates). Check with your school for the specific test schedule for your school.

- Acadience Reading (READ Act) EOY (end of year) tests K-3: Scheduled April 25th May 13th
- District Benchmark (EOY) tests grades 3 11: Scheduled May 2nd May 13th (optional)
- **Election of New SAC Officers:** April is the month to elect, or be thinking about election of officers for the coming school year as outlined in D11 Reg. AE-R-2, School Accountability Committees. It is also a good time to set the SAC meeting calendar for the next school year.

SAC Training Session on April 7, 2022 In-person at Tesla and via WebEx 6:00 PM - 8:00 PM:

We have an information-packed session scheduled for the April 7th training session with a focus on One Plan/USIP initiatives for 22-23;

- One Plan/USIP Planning Summer Symposium: Natasha Crouse, Director Student Improvement will provide details on the One Plan/USIP Planning Summer Symposium to be held for all schools in late May or early June 2022. The goal of the symposium is to have key staff, <u>including SACs</u>, from each school review their key challenges and successes of the past year in the context of their 2021-2022 USIP and develop a draft USIP for the 2022-2023 school year. The presentation will include the latest on data availability (Hoonuit, Performance Matters, other data support, etc) and testimonials from last year's participants.
- Chicago 5E Winter Survey Results/Use in One Plans: Natasha Crouse will discuss best practices for understanding and interpreting the survey results along with strategies for SACs to use with their principal in relating results to overall student success. We also plan to spotlight schools with excellent parent survey participation.
- **Family Engagement Circles:** The purpose of Family Engagement Circles is to provide an opportunity for stakeholders to share their experiences as parents, caregivers, and community members. The last hour of the session will be spent piloting the Family Engagement Circle process with attendees.

Agenda Planning Guide for APRIL (Theme: Assessment/planning for next school year)

- Principal/teachers provide relevant 3rd quarter data for progress monitoring.
- Review available Spring District Benchmark assessment results, other assessment results and One Plan Action
 Step monitoring data. Check with your principal on availability of the school's academic growth data in Performance Matters.
- Discuss plans for school participation in the May-June One Plan/USIP Planning Symposium. Ask whether the school's leadership will have completed Performance Matters training before the Symposium.
- Elect/select SAC chair, secretary and other officers as appropriate for next school year.


