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District Accountability (DAC) Newsletter

April 2021

Welcome

April is here! Hard to believe we are in the final quarter of the school year. We are thankful for your work and dedication this year. This has been a challenging school year for all of us. Now is the time to reflect and start planning for the next school year. Start considering the areas that your School Accountability Committee changed this year, like on-line meetings. Is this something that should be continued next year for more participation? How else can we provide opportunities for all families to have a voice? The answers to these questions are specific to your school community. Let's build on the lessons we learned from this year to provide opportunities for all families.

Family School Community Partnerships (FSCP) are important for our goal to inspire every mind. Just as a space launch relies on a team of people working together to plan and complete a mission, families, schools, and communities can work together to launch children's learning. This involves collaboration. When families, schools, and communities work together throughout the year on their shared mission, student learning takes off. Look later in this newsletter for some resources about FSCP.

The Academic Master Plan (AMP) was presented to the D11 community last month for feedback. It is exciting to see the opportunities for students at all schools as the district is rebuilding, rediscovering, and reimagining. Community feedback is valuable from every area. You know your school and community the best. The final AMP will go to the school board this month. Please continue to encourage families in your communities to give input to this plan as final decisions are made.

State testing will have changes this year. The federal government granted a waiver to Colorado to scale backstandardized testing this year. Usually all students K-8 take the literacy and math portion of the test. The waiver allows the state to test students in grades three, five, and seven only in literacy. Math tests will be administered in grades four, six, and eight. Only eight graders will take the science test and no social studies tests will be given. The exams won't be used to evaluate teacher performance or rate schools. SACs should reach out to principals for any questions.

The DAC and it's Subcommittees are continuing to work in the virtual environment.

- The DAC reviewed, discussed, and provided input on the Unified District Improvement Plan (UDIP), the Incremental Budget Requests for Fiscal Year 2021-2022, as well as looking at updates to Social Emotional Learning Surveys, Curriculum, and Counselor Updates.
- The DAC Accreditation Subcommittee spent time focused on the UDIP.
- The Training and SAC Support Subcommittee is ready for the final SAC trainings cheduled on April 8 via Webex. The training will focus on the new Student Information System Update and the School Improvement Summer Symposium. Break-out sessions will be included for all school levels. More details are provided later in the newsletter. SACs and school principals are strongly encouraged to attend.

As a DAC, we want to support our School Accountability Committees. It is time to start preparing for elections for SAC Chair for next year. If we can provide any help or support please reach out so we can help. Once again, thank you for your dedication this school year!

SAC Information

Upcoming deadlines of interest to SACs

- State Tests: The Colorado State Legislature (and the Federal government) has approved a streamlined testing schedule for Spring 2021. Tests are scheduled in the period April 12 Apr 30th. Check out the D11 testing calendar (updated 03-30-2021) at 2020-2021 Assessment Calendar.pdf (d11.org) for specific test dates.
- Acadience Reading (READ Act) EOY (end of year) tests K-3: Scheduled April 26th May 14th
- Universal Screener EOY tests grades 3 11: Scheduled April 26th May 21st
- Unified School Improvement Plan Timelines:
 - Priority Improvement and Turnaround Schools: Has your school received feedback from The Colorado Dept. of Education (CDE) on your school's USIP submitted in Jan 2021? Feedback should have been made available to schools through the online "Collaboration" tab. If this applies to your school, keep checking with your principal regarding feedback. Required updates, based on the feedback, should be submitted to meet the April 15, 2021 final submission date (may be optional check with your principal).
 - ♦ All Other Schools: Final USIPs are due to CDE for all schools by April 15, 2021 (may be optional check with your principal). Now is a good time to compare 3rd Quarter test results and performance data with USIP academic performance targets, and check implementation data for Major Improvement Strategies to evaluate how well your USIP is working and make changes as necessary before the April deadline.
 - ♦ Looking forward to the 2021 2022 School Year: Schools will be required to submit USIPs for the 2021-2022 school year no later than Oct 15, 2021 (see item below on the D11 School Improvement Summer Symposium coming the first week of June 2021). As SACs, ask your principal to be included in this process as part of your USIP role.
- Election of New SAC Officers: April is the month to elect, or be thinking about election of officers for
 the coming school year as outlined in AE-R-2, School Accountability Committees. It is also a good time
 to set the SAC meeting calendar for the next school year. Looking for a great SAC website to show potential new SAC members? Check out the Sabin MS SAC webpage at https://www.d11.org/Page/3152.
- <u>D11 Academic Master Plan (AMP):</u> The AMP final report and recommendations will go to the Board of Education for non-action on April 14th and for Action on April 28th. Look for notifications about presentations to specific school sites between Apr 5th and Apr 13th. Keep checking https://www.d11.org/rebuilding for all the latest on the AMP and FMP.

We have an information-packed session scheduled for the April 8th training session with a focus on what will be new in Fall 2021;

- Student Information System Update/Cyber Strategy: John McCarron, Assistant Superintendent/CIO Technology Services and Tom Hunt SIS Project Officer will headline the session with an update on implementation of the new Power School Student Information System and all the applications being integrated into the SIS—plus more.
- School Improvement Summer Symposium: Dr David Khaliqi, Executive Director of Education Insights and Natasha Crouse, Director Student Improvement will provide details on the School Improvement Summer Symposium to be held for all schools the first week in June 2021. The goal of the symposium is to have key staff from each school review their key challenges and successes of the past year in the context of their 2020-2021 USIP and develop a draft USIP for the 2021-2022 school year.
- Breakout Sessions (There will be three chose one):
 - Employee/Family Wellness: Cory Notestine (and team), Executive Director, Student Health and Wellness will provide tips and resources for dealing with the severe workloads and stress associated with the COVID 19 environment we are operating in.
 - Individual Career & Academic Plan (ICAP) Program Status Update and Initiatives for 2021-2022: Valarie Scates, Counseling Services Facilitator, and Dawn Boden, Career and College Access Specialist, will provide an update on all ICAP initiatives with a focus on implementation of the new Course Planning tool in Naviance. [Note: Naviance has also been purchased by Power School.]
 - ◆ D11 Comprehensive Literacy Plan Update Initiatives for 2021-2022: Karol Gates, Director Curriculum and Instruction (and team) will provide an update on the status of this plan with a focus on READ Act requirements, teacher training, new K-12 curricular resources/strategies, and incorporating writing into the curriculum.
