

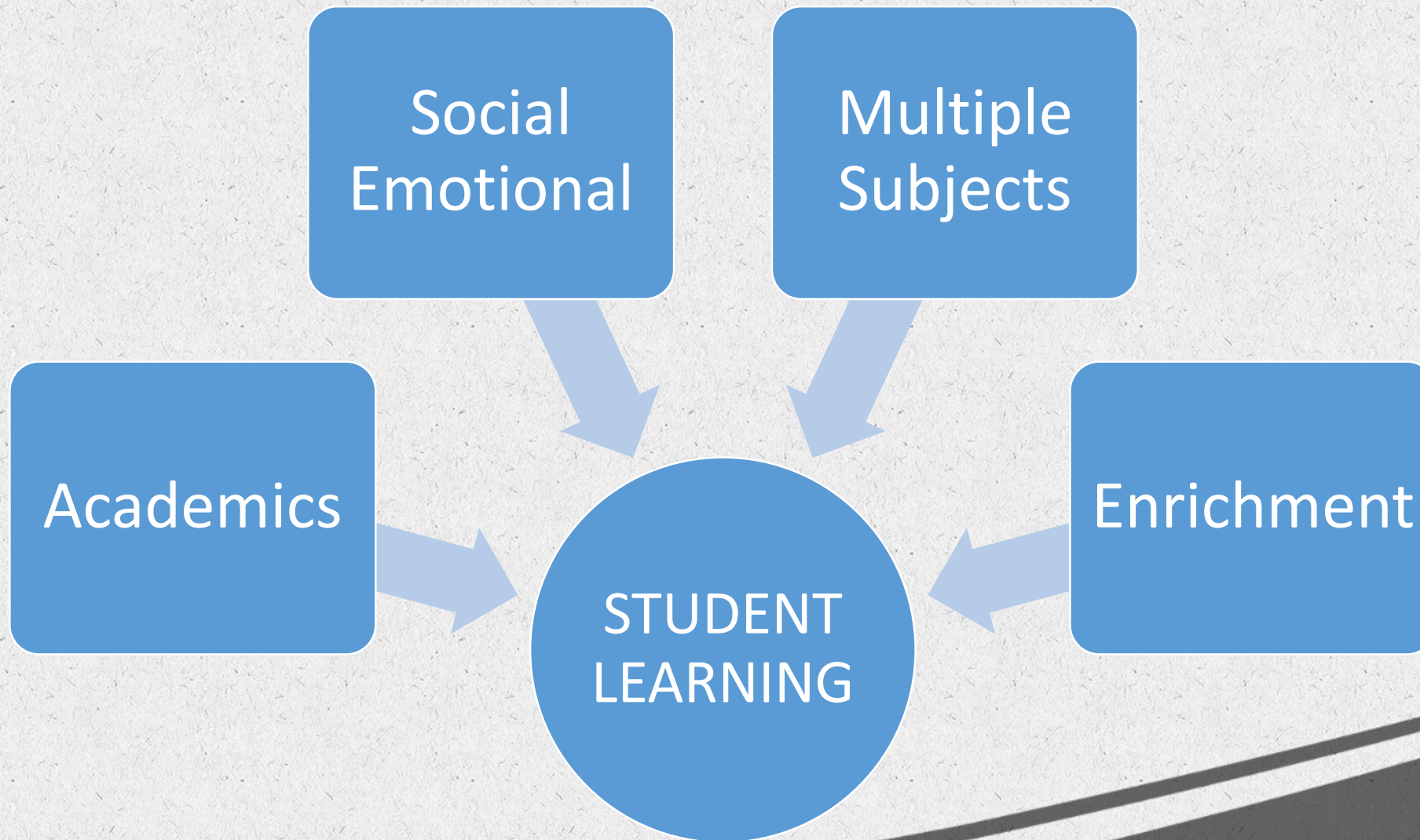

Four Elements of Summer Bridge



Summary of Academics

- All schools focused on unfinished learning and emphasized preparing students for the next school year.
- Elementary and middle schools targeted mathematics and reading.
- High schools targeted credit recovery, essential standards, and preparation for the next course in the subject area.

Examples of Enrichment

- Experiential learning
- STEM
- Project based learning (PBL)
- Essentials such as Visual Arts and Physical Education
- Field trips
- Programs from community partners
- School-wide activities
- Showcases
- Performances

Examples of Social Emotional Learning

- School-wide themes and/or projects
- Targeted SEL lessons
- Small group sessions with Mental Health Provider
- 1:1 check-ins with Mental Health Provider
- Mental health support on as needed basis
- Academic advisement with counselor

Examples SMART goals

Academics

ELA-Grades 3-8

Summer Bridge students who score 80% or more correct on the CFA pre-test will maintain or exceed pre-test score on the CFA post-test. Students who score under 80% correct on the CFA pre-test will improve their percent correct on the CFA post-test by at least 15%.

Math-Grades 3-8

Summer Bridge students who score 80% or more correct on the CFA pre-test will maintain or exceed pre-test score on the CFA post-test. Students who score under 80% correct on the CFA pre-test will improve their percent correct on the CFA post-test by at least 20%.

Enrichment

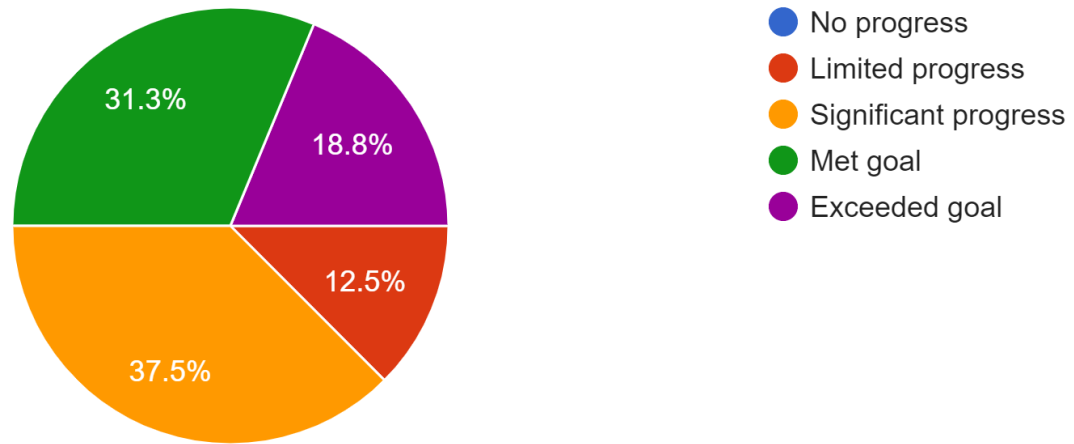
By day 19 of Summer Bridge students will show improvement in PE, science and art by increasing their individual accuracy on 6 tasks that are also done on Day 2 of Summer Bridge. Two physical tasks (balance & coordination), two science tasks (similarities/differences in a variety of plants) and two art tasks (patterns). All students will complete 5 of the 6 tasks accurately by day 19.

Social Emotional

Students will demonstrate SEL growth in social awareness and coping skills competencies as measured by school-wide Panorama assessment pre/post model given in the first and last week of Summer Bridge.

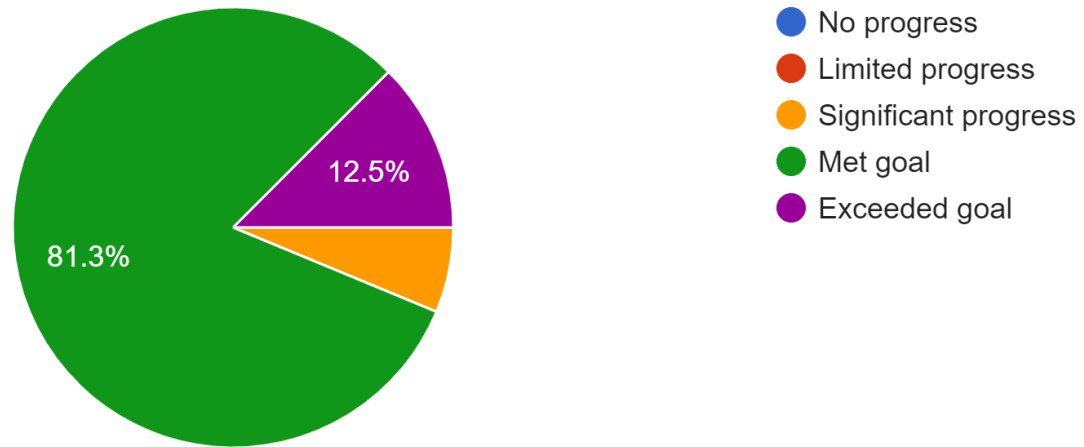
Academic SMART Goals Progress

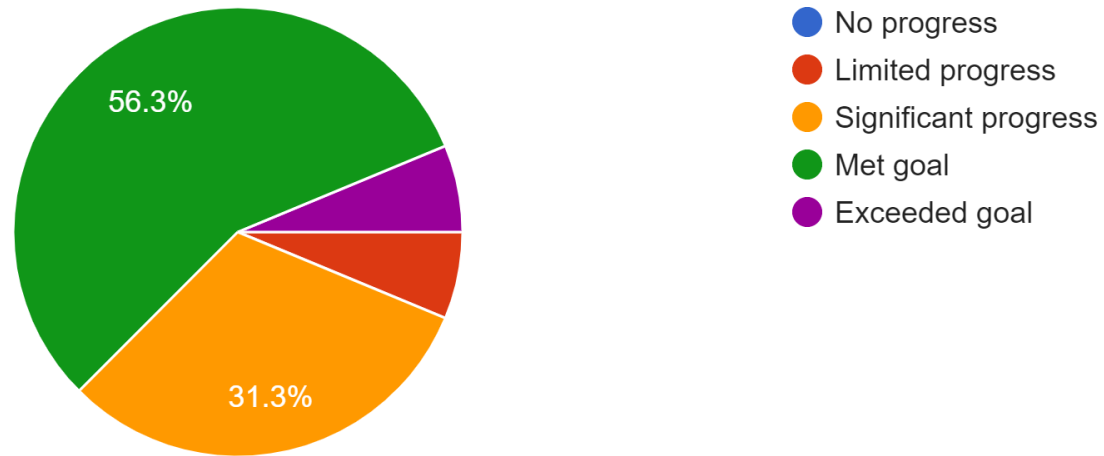
Enrichment SMART Goals Progress

- Students regularly attended enrichment-based classes such as Visual Arts, Physical Education, STEAM, etc.

Reflections from Social Emotional SMART Goals

- Mental Health Providers regularly met with students
- 1:1, small group, and tier one support
- Use of Panorama Survey

Successes

- Small class sizes
- FREE for students
- Common Formative Assessments
- Access to instructional programs
- Community partnerships
- Enrichment opportunities

Challenges

- Enrollment, especially the timeline and remote enrollment processes
- Attendance, especially toward the end of the program
- Logistics (staffing, schedules, transportation, etc.)

Suggestions

- Improve enrollment timeline and processes
- Attendance incentive for families
- Math (K-5) and reading (3-5) resources
- School planning guide
