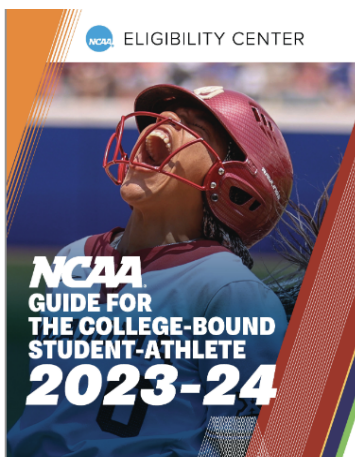


NCAA Eligibility Center News and Webinar

Differences Between NCAA Divisions I, II and III

- Division I schools may provide tuition and fees, room and board, books and other expenses related to attendance at the school.
- Division II full scholarships cover tuition and fees, room and board, and course-related books and supplies.
- Division III schools do not offer athletics scholarships.
