This week has been very exciting and rewarding as we have welcomed back our cohorts to the physical classroom, and have interacted with our students online simultaneously! Please know that regardless of the unique nature of our return to learn, you will find that Odyssey ECCO instructors and staff focus on the success of all learners. Hola, parents, guardians, and students. I know there is a lot of information just for navigating classes let alone learning another language. Here are some terms I think will help.

D2L-I only post grades here. Other teachers post assignments and discussions. Access D2L with your S# (S12345678) and your password. The first time you log in your password is Studentmmddyyyy (birthdate). I will give you your S# 1 time. Grades in D2L are current. Per FERPA you do not have to show anyone D2L. I post grades in "grades."

Q: Attendance and grades for progress reports only. Once a grade is submitted in Q I can't change it until the next marking period. If you have a D or F you will continue to get calls until the grade updates in the next marking period. If you are more than 10 minutes late, absent for more than 10 minutes, or are not actively participating in WebEX you may be marked absent.

Teams=This is where I post practice assignments we do in class every day. Find assignments by date. Use Files for the IRKs and other worksheets. Ignore past due dates for these.

IRK=instructors resource kit. This refers to chapter and page number. IRK 2_18 is chapter 2, page 18. Use these to practice speaking with a partner. Your partner does not have to speak Spanish; it helps if you just have someone listen.

Schoology=assignments you must turn in. Sometimes Schoology gives an incorrect score; I will hand grade assignments in this case. You have 3 tries to submit each assignment in Schoology. They must be completed by the due date; check each week, on Monday, to see what's due. If you miss the Schoology date you must contact me to make arrangements to complete work for 60% of the original score.

Tu Mundo (Your World) = the name of your textbook. If you need help accessing the digital copy please contact me. Schoology assignments with page numbers refer to your textbook.

To inspire more Coloradans to continue their education, all 32 public colleges and universities in Colorado and several private institutions will allow students to apply for free on Tuesday, Oct. 13 as part of the third <u>Colorado Free Application Day.</u>

Colorado Free Application Day caps off <u>Colorado Applies Month</u>, a five-week campaign that guides 11th- and 12-grade students and adult job seekers along the application process. Admissions application information for each institution will available on the campaign website soon, and fees will be waived for applications submitted on Oct. 13 only.

The high school graduating class of 2021 will also have the **option to include or** not include their SAT or ACT scores with their college applications as Colorado colleges have implemented a "test-optional" policy making the college application process even easier for students this year. To learn more about the test-optional policy click <u>here</u>.

The statewide push is designed to increase Colorado's stagnant college-going and FAFSA completion rates. Despite being one of the most educated states in the country, Colorado sends just 56 percent of high school graduates to a college, university or certificate program, and just 50 percent of students submit a FAFSA application—a key indicator of students' likelihood to continue their education.

By removing barriers for students to achieve a credential, Colorado can increase the number of students who complete their programs and enter the workforce with a degree or competitive skills. Nearly 75 percent of Colorado jobs require a postsecondary credential. Colorado Free Application Day encourages residents to live up to their fullest potential.


- Time management and organization
