Students, to prepare you for closer to the normal academic experience, please put all your effort into performing your best. Your academic performance is the data we use to make instructional decisions and provide you with the best supports and interventions. We need to see your academic ability, so we can place you in the courses best suited for you. We need to know, what you know.

One opportunity for students to showcase their academic ability is next week's PSAT and SAT. By now, everyone should have received an email and automated call to inform them of next week's standardized tests. In-person learners will be taking either the SAT, PSAT 8/9 or the PSAT 10. Inspire students can contact Dr. Lamphere at MIKE.LAMPHERE@d11.org if they wish to take the test. The following tests will be offered:

 - Busses only run from RJWAC to home high schools during early releases
 - Grades 9 and 10 attend only. Off campus students attend class at PPCC, Grade 11 on-campus students attend asynchronously.

 - April 14th from 7:30 am-12:30 pm
 - o Lunch from 12:30-1:00 pm
 - o Early release to home at 1:00 pm
 - o Busses only run from RJWAC to home high schools during early releases
 - \circ Grades 9 and 10 attend only. Off campus students attend class at PPCC, Grade 11 on-campus students attend asynchronously.
- Inspire students and students who choose not to test will complete asynchronous activities in Schoology during their testing day. Those activities will be used to take attendance.

Graduating seniors, if you are not aware, your graduation date and time are locked in. Odyssey Early College and Career Options graduation will be held at Garry Berry Stadium on May 20th, starting at noon. We are excited to have graduation on our home campus! In the event we experience any adverse weather, secondary plans are being developed and will be released to families of graduates soon.
