Odyssey ECCO sudoCYBER NCCSA Chapter CTSO Hosts U.S State Department International Leadership Visitors Program

At the request of the Colorado Springs EDC and Colorado Springs World Affairs Council our sudoCYBER CTSO students hosted a group from the U.S. State Department's International Leadership Visitors program.

The focus of this U.S State Department program was cybersecurity. Our 34 visitors were all cybersecurity experts visiting from 30 different countries from around the globe.

Our students utilized their cyber and network skills and knowledge to prepared and demonstrate a range of concepts and technologies including, how threat agents can use network management tools such as Wireshark and Nmap as offensive tools, password security and building simulated networks using Cisco Packet Tracer.

Congratulations to our students for making the visit to our Cyber Lab "the highlight" of their nation-wide tour.

Colorado Free Application Day is Tuesday, Oct. 15, 2019!

On <u>Colorado Free Application Day</u>, you can apply for FREE at Colorado's 32 public colleges and universities and several private institutions.

How does it work? Students must submit a completed admissions application between 12:01 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. on Oct. 15, 2019 only. Any admissions applications that have been started but not submitted may not be granted a waiver. Each institution will have a unique process to waive the admissions application submission fee. Visit the Colorado Free Application Day webpage to find specific information by institution.

To take advantage of <u>Colorado Free Application Day</u>, it's best to have all admissions application materials prepared, double-checked and reviewed before October 15. That way, you can submit a high-quality, complete application and improve your chances of getting accepted.

Colorado Free Application Day caps off Colorado Applies Month, a statewide campaign that encourages high school seniors to successfully apply to a job or higher education program and submit their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
