Welcome back! I want to take a moment and wish everyone a Happy New Year! I hope you all had an enjoyable and relaxing holiday break.

Second semester is a great time for reflecting on the past semester and looking forward to the rest of the school year. Parents and Guardians, I would encourage you to sit down and chat about how school is progressing with your student and think about setting reasonable goals for this semester. This is a great opportunity to begin strong and have game plans as the semester progresses.

For many seniors, this might be your last semester of work. If you are planning for graduation, don't forget there are procedures and items that need to be completed before you can walk across that stage. If you haven't reached out to your counselor yet, do so as soon as possible!

As for freshman, sophomore, and juniors, it's time to start thinking about the testing season. Most English and Math instructors are having students work in Khan Academy once a week. If you aren't currently working in Khan Academy, don't forget that you can link past test scores for a personalized PSAT/SAT study plan. A 2017 study of students who used Khan as their PSAT/SAT practice in addition to school support, showed that students who studied for 20 hours on Khan Academy had an average score gain of 115 points. That is almost double the average gain associated with those who don't use Kahn Academy's free test prep.

Finally, we are holding our 8th-grade open house on January 23rd, from 6 pm-7:30 pm in the Roy J Wasson Academic Campus Auditorium. If you have any potential interested 8th-grade students that would be interested in joining Odyssey, please feel free to share! 

The Stroud Scholars – High Promise Program

Colorado College is launching a new program, Stroud Scholars, in its continuing effort to increase accessibility and help students from communities historically excluded from higher education forge a path to college.

The program will prepare students for higher education by working directly with high-promise students in the Pikes Peak region who aspire to attend college but face a range of barriers to college acceptance and success. Stroud Scholars seeks to provide academic preparation, mentorship, and guidance navigating admissions and financial aid processes to Colorado College and beyond.

"An outstanding college education should be within reach for highly talented students in our own backyard who simply need opportunity and support," says Colorado College President Jill Tiefenthaler. "Through the Stroud Scholars program, we will work with area schools to identify high-achieving students and prepare them for success in college and beyond."

The goal of the Stroud Scholars program is to offer a developmental pathway starting the summer after a student's first year of high school and ending with the successful transition into Colorado College or another college or university of the student's choice. For three summers, at no cost to the students or their families, CC will host participants on campus for a three-week summer academy.

During this time, students will take classes with Colorado College faculty focusing on quantitative reasoning and writing skills to ensure they are academically prepared for a selective academic environment. Participants also will engage in programming designed to help them prepare for the college admissions and financial aid processes. **Students successfully completing the three-year program will earn admission to Colorado College and receive a comprehensive financial aid package.**

SUMMARY OF PROGRAM OFFERINGS

- No-cost three-year summer program beginning with rising sophomores
- Three weeks in length each summer.
- Residing on campus during the week, participants can live at home on weekends
- Two core college readiness courses: quantitative reasoning and composition
- Critical inquiry workshops and enrichment activities in the afternoons
- Academic year workshops to prepare youth & their families for admissions/financial aid info.
- Yearlong mentorship and guidance from CC students, staff, and faculty
