

Hello and welcome to the new Career and Technical Education Counselor for Career Pathways at Odyssey ECCO – Leilani Mullins!

Leilani is new to D11 counseling, but brings personal and professional experience in College and Career preparation and Postsecondary Workforce Readiness. In high school, Leilani participated in Career and Technical Education, as both a Family and Consumer Sciences and Business student, and fell in love with the opportunities CTE classes offered both in the classroom and through hands-on experience. She participated in the Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSOs), as a National Competitor, State Officer, and National Vice President of Membership for Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA), and as a national competitor for Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA). After high school, she attended the University of Colorado, Colorado Springs (UCCS), where she received her BA in Organizational Communication, and transitioned into her professional career as a UCCS Admissions Counselor. During her time as an admissions counselor, she learned that there are so many options for students after high school, and that college was only one path that students could take. She then pursued her MA in School Counseling, at UCCS, and is excited to move into the role of working with high school students. As a CTE Counselor, Leilani feels that she has come full circle to the type of work that helped prepare her for the future. We will continue to collaborate with high school and middle school counselors, administration, students and parents throughout D11 to develop an awareness of Career Pathways and the many opportunities a pathways student can access.

How do I study for Spanish?

The Spanish syllabi state that students need to study for 30 minutes every night but how do you know what to study and how to study effectively? Here are some tips:

- *make flashcards: 15 flashcards are required prior to every test. Make them at the start of the chapter and study them while you are waiting at the dentist, on the bus, etc.
- *Quizlet: if it's on Quizlet, it's on the test. Go to Quizlet.com and search Susan Dallam for study guides for each chapter.
- *Spaleon.com: Having trouble conjugating verbs? This is your site. Pick your tense and make a personal selection of verbs you want to study.
- *Aprenderespanol.org: this site has great activities for every concept you need to know to learn Spanish.
- *Yabla: if your Spanish is more advanced or you want to learn Spanish in context this is the site. District 11 has purchased a subscription; our username and password can be found in 'files' on Office 365 along with videos for each chapter in "Tu Mundo."


