

BALDY VIEW ROP RECEIVES EXCELLENT REPORTS FROM COUNCIL ON OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION (COE) AND WESTERN ASSOCIATION OF



SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES (WASC) ACCREDITATION AGENCIES

Baldy View ROP (BVROP) hosted virtual team visits from Council on Occupational Education (COE) and Accrediting Commission for Schools-Western Association of Schools and Colleges (ACS–WASC) during the week of February 1-5, 2021 to reaffirm accreditation for BVROP secondary and adult education programs. Throughout the week, the visiting teams met with stakeholders, instructors, and staff as well as interviewed current students and alumni to verify and confirm program plans, procedures, and processes, which were documented in self-study reports. The teams also verified records and data as well as observed virtual classrooms.

At the end of the virtual visit, the teams presented their exit reports and recommended BVROP for reaffirmation accreditation for both agencies. The WASC team report reported an excellent score and the COE team completed the report with zero findings. BVROP received official exit reports which detailed the effectiveness of the self-study reports and overall standards/criterion met. Thank you to all who prepared, participated, supported, and reported. Your involvement makes a difference and contributes to the success of the accreditation process, reports, and approval.


SPOTLIGHT ON THE STUDENTS

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

Transportation Distribution Logistics (TDL), & UPS Partnership



Baldy View ROP (BVROP) program, Transportation Distribution Logistics (TDL), had the opportunity to collaborate with UPS since its inception. UPS has played an integral part in assisting with the program's curriculum and ensuring that what students learn is not only UPS-centered, but industry-centered. The collaboration with UPS also extends to the design and layout of the Career Training Center Logistics building. UPS provided significant support and guidance by having their engineers, like Tony Ko, work with the BVROP Grant Liaison and Logistics Instructor to create the most ideal yet practical hands-on exposure for students through equipment and educational curriculum. As a result, each piece of equipment, software, and the classroom desks and chairs were all designed with UPS and demonstrated how integral the supply chain is to the Inland Empire.

As one of TDL's industry partners, the partnership has been highly impactful. UPS demonstrated their commitment to the TDL program and approved a banner inside the Logistics building to display their proud partnership. Additionally, students from the 2019-20 school year participated in the opportunity to earn a TDL Student Scholarship that was provided through UPS. Three students recipients were given scholarships to support post-secondary goals! UPS extended their partnership and collaboration a step further by encouraging the TDL program to acquire a Warehouse Management System (WMS) through Deposoco. Recognizing the changes in automation and technology in the Supply Chain, UPS advised the TDL program to implement a



WMS so that students would be prepared to enter the job market successfully with relevant skills and exposure to industry technology.

The BVROP and UPS partnership has also produced and allowed students who successfully complete the TDL program to start their careers with UPS. UPS has provided campus interview workshops for TDL students, and TDL students have visited UPS facilities through field trips. Overall, the partnership with UPS continues to grow and students experience immense benefits through the TDL program and partnership.

May is Asian American Pacific Islander Heritage Month

Asian Pacific American Heritage Month originated with Congress in 1977, when Rep. Frank Horton of New York introduced a resolution proclaiming the first 10 days in May as Asian Pacific American Heritage Week, and Sen. Daniel Inouye put forth a similar resolution. Neither passed, but the following year, Horton tried again and succeeded, and a joint resolution passed by the House and Senate was signed into law by President Jimmy Carter on Oct. 5, 1978.

In the 1990s, Congress expanded the recognition to a full month. The month of May was chosen to commemorate the immigration of the first Japanese to the United States on May 7, 1843, and to mark the anniversary of the completion of the transcontinental railroad on May 10, 1869. The majority of the workers who laid the tracks were Chinese immigrants.

The May celebration includes all of the Asian continent and the Pacific islands of Melanesia (New Guinea, New Caledonia, Vanuatu, Fiji and the Solomon Islands), Micronesia (Marianas, Guam, Wake Island, Palau, Marshall Islands, Kiribati, Nauru and the Federated States of Micronesia) and Polynesia (New Zealand, Hawaiian Islands, Rotuma, Midway Islands, Samoa, American Samoa, Tonga, Tuvalu, Cook Islands, French Polynesia and Easter Island).

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
