

HVAC Systems

Students taking the HVAC Systems course at Chaffey High School (CHS) with Instructor Reyes Vazquez finished another strong semester in gaining the hands-on training, experience, and certifications necessary for employment in the HVAC industry.

"The students have gained a tremendous amount of skill due to the hard work they've invested in themselves and this course. I'm just providing the guidance and safety. The rest is all their hard work," Instructor Vazquez said.

Recent projects have included installing new HVAC systems complete with controls, wiring, and proper refrigerant charges, utilizing brazing techniques to install valves, and troubleshooting HVAC systems problems through a virtual program. 
