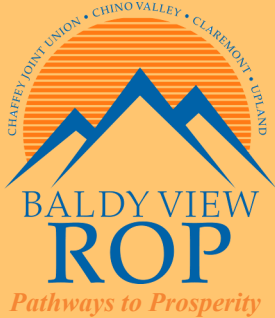

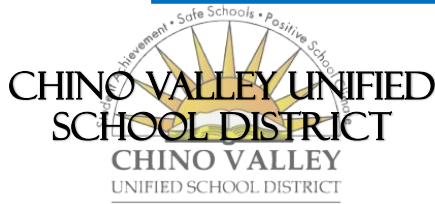

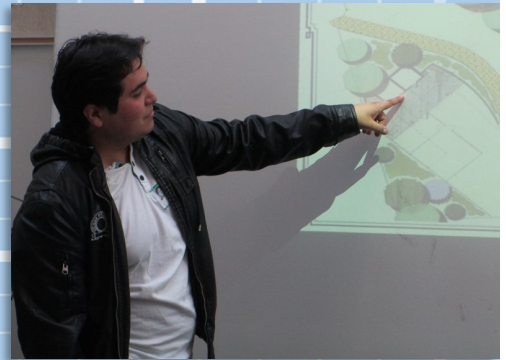

Video Production/Website Design

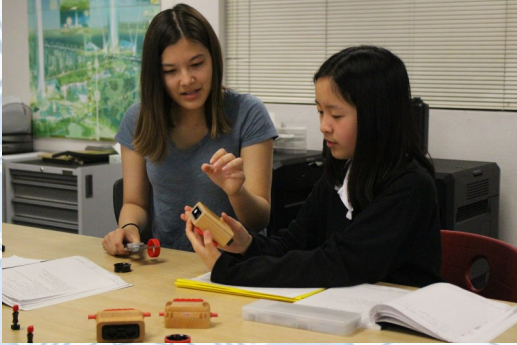
Students taking the BVROP Video Production and Website Design course at San Antonio High School (SAHS) within Claremont Unified School District learn valuable skills in visual communication. Instructor Juan Alaniz works with students to help them learn the essential elements of video production such as lighting, sound, and how to work with industry-recognized software Adobe Premiere. Students also learn about code websites using the common coding languages HTML5 and CSS. Together, their skills in producing videos and websites provide students with employable skills in modern technological equipment, software, and coding.

“Video Production is very exciting because we learn new things every day. One day we might be interviewing each other and then the next day we edit those interviews. We work with all kinds of lighting and camera equipment too,” SAHS junior Natalie Martinez shared.

SAHS junior Gabriel Lopez discussed his experience with the Website Design component of the course, saying, “It’s really fun to see the code we use create a website. Before this course I didn’t know how that was possible. Now I know how to create websites and have experience, so I will be better prepared later. I could also develop my own website now instead of having someone else create it for me.”

SPOTLIGHT ON THE STUDENTS

Introduction to Engineering Design

The BVROP Introduction to Engineering Design Course taught at Ayala High School (AHS) within Chino Valley Unified School District teaches students about the various ways structures are built. Instructor Michael Collins teaches students how to solve structural and design problems through engineering. It is also a foundation course for more advanced BVROP Engineering courses at AHS, such as Principles of Engineering.

A recent class activity focused on reverse engineering. Students worked with model vehicles comprised of multiple parts and took them apart, working backwards to explore how they are made and operate. Students weighed and measured the various parts, made a series of calculations based upon these measurements, and recorded what they found. The goal was for students to ultimately create improved designs for the vehicles utilizing their data.

AHS ninth grader Faith Park discussed her experience with the class activity. "We use a dial caliber which measures length to the thousandth inch, so it's very accurate. It helps us to measure parts of the car as accurately as possible so we can record and use the best data," she said.

AHS ninth grader Roderick Billedo said he would recommend the course to others. "I would definitely recommend this course. It's well-taught, teaches us good work habits, how to work on a team, and also how to present our information and speak publicly," he shared.

Automotive Technology

Students taking the BVROP Automotive Technology courses at Etiwanda High School (EHS) within Chaffey Joint Union High School District with Instructor Bernardo Alvarado-Batres receive comprehensive instruction about auto repair and maintenance. Students have the opportunity to not only work with industry-relevant equipment, including hydraulic lifts, power and manual-operated tools, but to repair cars for people who take their vehicles into the school's shop for service.

EHS junior and Automotive Technology student Jessica Nimerick has been able to help fix her aunt's engine directly in class.

"It's exciting to work with all of the automotive equipment and to be able to work on my aunt's truck in class is really fun," she said.

Alta Loma High School senior Jason Raynor has assisted Jessica in repairing the truck. His goal is to continue his education and to one day work on diesel engines.

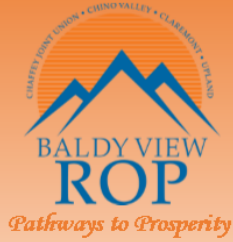
"This course provides a foundation and gives me good experience working with cars. We also learn about electrical systems within vehicles since that is so important to cars these days. We work with a voltmeter to diagnose electrical problems in vehicles such as if wires are cut or not receiving power. We really learn a lot here!" he said.
