



Over the course of 39 weeks, Ms. Garcia will prepare students to learn the many skills of administrative and clinical medical assisting. Students will also train to earn their Phlebotomy certification.

Highlights of this year's class? In addition to these students beginning their pathway to success in a growing, in-demand field, students will be the first to train in a newly remodeled, state-of-the-art skills lab devoted specifically to the Medical Assistant program! When asked what she is looking forward to, Medical Assistant student, Angelica Bautista, replied, "I'm looking forward to the hands-on training we'll receive in the skills lab and during our internship. It'll help prepare me for a career in healthcare."

Classmate, Karla Leimer, explained the school's accreditation, convenient Monday through Friday schedule, and small class size were key in her decision to enroll with Baldy View ROP. "The 8 to 12 schedule gives the instructor the opportunity to explain course material thoroughly, yet still offers me the flexibility to work while I'm training to become a Medical Assistant."

Principles of Engineering

Presentations are a central part of the BVROP Principles of Engineering course at Ayala High School (AHS) in Chino Valley Unified School District (CVUSD) with Instructor Michael Collins. On Thursday, January 24, six pairs of students from the course took their presenting skills to a new level as they pitched proposed pedestrian bridge designs to the community at the Chino Hills City Council Chamber. Students worked in class to design a hypothetical bridge to aid in pedestrian traffic at Ayala High School. The projects covered extensive ground in the engineering process including

research, cost analysis, math, science, and

artistic imagination. The goals of each bridge was not only to be functional but to fit in aesthetically with the campus.

AHS sophomore Sidney Ackerman shared, "This project helped me to practice communicating my ideas. If you're not able to communicate what you're proposing, then people will not receive the information the right way. Communicating is a big part of engineering."

Sidney's project partner, AHS sophomore Joshua Seri, added, "It's inspiring to learn from Instructor Collins and to see what's possible in engineering. The best part about this project was the freedom we had to be creative. It really helped us get used to the design process."

Computer Programming & Game Design

Students in the BVROP Computer Programming & Game Design course at Claremont High School with Instructor Brent Gilson worked in groups to recreate a prototype version of a popular computer game called "Bloons Tower Defense." The students' prototypes served to showcase the functionalities of the game. In order to create their prototypes, students developed programming to replicate various functions within the game, including currency and health meter systems, path-finding abilities for the playable characters, and artificial intelligence systems to provide challenges for the gameplayer.

"Students created their prototypes in just three weeks using advanced

and complex programming methods. They worked their way up to functioning games after starting out with a blank coding canvas," Instructor Gilson shared

Students focused on utilizing the concept of "lists" in programming to allow game objects to replicate themselves, and instantiate in certain locations within the game through the use of holding multiple locations within the lists. This helps ensure the game's functionality as objects need to appear and reappear throughout the course of game play in order to create the interactive elements that make the game possible.






Progress on the Logistics Building at the CTC


