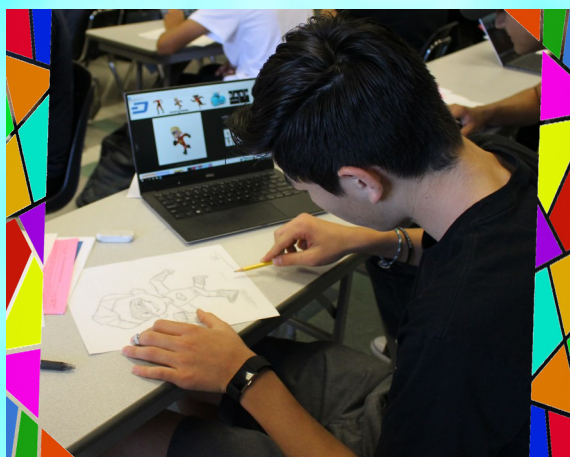

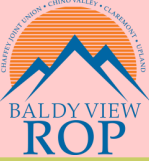

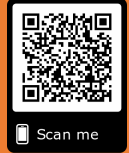

Omnitrans Bus Line Coming to the CTC!

A new way to get to class at the Baldy View ROP Career Training Center in Ontario is fast approaching! Beginning August 13th, Omnitrans Route 86 will start providing direct bus service to the CTC every Monday through Friday with trips as early as 5am and as late as 9pm.

The Omnitrans bus stop will be conveniently located at the entrance of the CTC for quick and easy transportation for students, staff, parents, and visitors. The bus stop will feature a new premium shelter, with enhanced amenities including solar panels for lighting in the evening, a digital real-time bus arrival sign, and a bike rack.

Omnitrans provides safe, reliable, environmentally-responsible, and affordable transportation to San Bernardino Valley residents, with more than 30 routes serving 15 communities. Bus fare is just \$1.75 for individual trips, and students can save by purchasing 1-day, 7-day, or 31-day bus passes. Reduced fares are offered for youth under age 18, seniors, veterans, Medicare recipients, and persons with disabilities.

Paperless bus fare and passes are available digitally via the Token Transit app. Riders simply show the bus driver their pass on a mobile device as they board the bus. Token Transit eliminates the need for exact change by allowing you to pre-pay for your digital pass with a debit or credit card. Parents may also take advantage of the Send-A-Pass feature, which allows you to pay for and send a pass to the rider by simply entering their mobile phone number!

Omnitrans friendly drivers look forward to seeing Baldy View ROP students aboard their busses starting this fall semester! 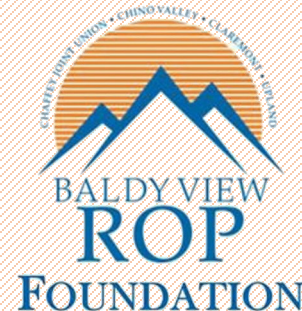

The course included clinical hours spent at a pediatric clinic on Monte Vista Avenue not far from Montclair High School. She took the course because she had an interest in medicine and also wanted to learn technical skills for employment. While she later found out that education was her true passion, taking ROP provided her with valuable skills for employment. After high school, Ms. Saenz worked as a medical assistant throughout college.

“I made pretty much double the pay as a medical assistant than what my friends made in their jobs after high school. Not only are there high-wage benefits to these courses, but students can earn valid certifications that they can only earn as high school students through this program. College and career preparation is ROP. It’s a great partnership between the districts and Baldy View ROP.”

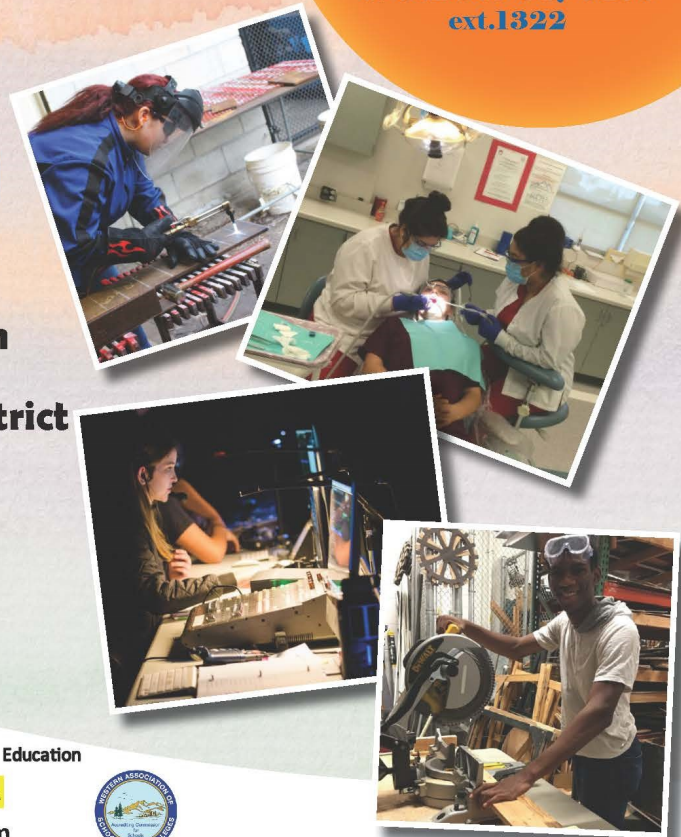


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Staff News and Notes

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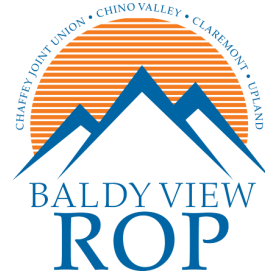
