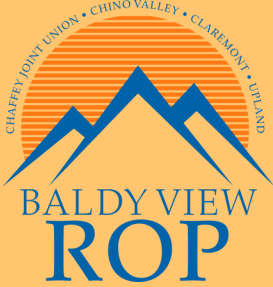

Heating, Ventilation, & Air Conditioning (HVAC) Systems

Students taking the HVAC course at Chaffey High School with Instructor Reyes Vazquez receive hands-on training to work directly with heating and cooling units, a vital trade in the community regardless of region or industry. As students continue to learn the training necessary to enter this high-demand field, they also work towards the opportunity to earn the Environmental Protection Agency 608 certification as well as to earn community college credit towards Mt. San Antonio College's HVAC program.

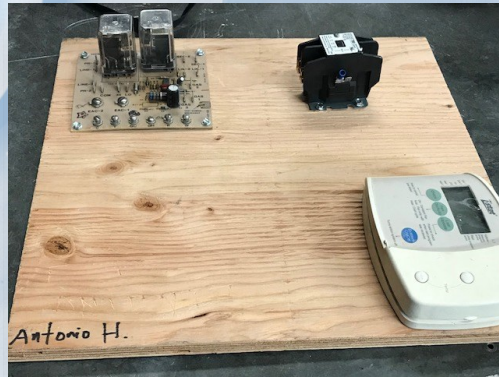

The Baldy View ROP Criminal Justice students with Instructor Joe Nash at Claremont High School received a first-hand look at the judicial system during a recent field trip to the Pomona Courthouse. The field trip was hosted by Municipal Court Judge Salvador Cerna. Judge Cerna discussed various court-related occupations with the students which included judges, defense and prosecution attorneys, bailiffs, and court reporters, as well as the role jurors play in the legal process. Afterwards, students participated in a mock trial involving some familiar names, where the defendant Dorothy Gail was accused of one count of PC 187, which is murder, for allegedly throwing water on the Wicked Witch of the West. Sage Salazar did not always know what she wanted to do for a living when she was a high school student. It was not until she took the Baldy View ROP Registered Dental Assistant course her senior year while a student at Chino High School that she discovered her passion for orthodontics.

“I had the same issue I think a lot of high school students go through: I knew I was smart enough to do something with my life, but not sure how to channel my energy into something positive. The Baldy View ROP course I took really gave me a confidence and sense of direction that I had been lacking,” Sage shared.

Today, Sage works full time as an office supervisor with BigSmile Orthodontics. She did not stop there. In 2016 she started her own program, the Southern California Orthodontic Assisting School of which she is president. The program prepares students to earn their Orthodontic Assistant Permit.

For Sage, her introduction to Orthodontics is a vivid memory. She recalls practicing on the typodont, which is an artificial teeth study model.

“I remember the day we started reviewing orthodontics in the program like it was yesterday. I was hooked! I thought it was so fun practicing on the typodont. I must have un-tied and re-tied the typodont a hundred times,” she shared.

Grace explained how she has continued to build on her early skills learned in ROP today.

On a daily basis I use the fundamental clinical and laboratory skills that I learned from Baldy View ROP. Working with study models is one of my favorite things to do, it’s like an art. You can fabricate appliances such as bite plates, expanders, retainers...you name it, you can build it!”

Sage also shared that finishing her ROP program was highly rewarding, saying, “My family was proud when I finished my ROP program, but I felt proud of myself for the first time ever. ROP gave me the confidence to venture out into the world.”

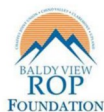

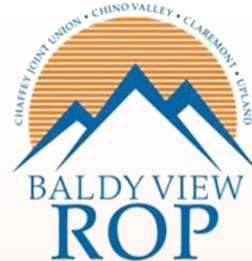

Vocational Nursing Students Prepare for Graduation and the NCLEX Exam

For the past 17 months, students have studied, trained, and tested with a single goal in mind: graduate, pass the NCLEX, and become valuable Licensed Vocational Nurses in the community! With April 19th drawing near, students completing the top-ranked Licensed Vocational Nursing program at Baldy View ROP prepare for the final leg of their journey and graduation. To help prepare students for the National Council Licensure Examination, also known as the NCLEX, Vocational Nursing Director, Dr. Mahmoud, has been working with students in the newly enhanced state-of-the-art skills lab running simulations that mirror experiences graduates will encounter during their career. The NCLEX is a nationwide examination for the licensing of nurses in the United States that all LVN candidates must pass in order to practice.

Since returning from winter break in January, Dr. Mahmoud and her staff have been intensely focused on preparing students for program completion and their state exam. In addition to lab simulations, students have been completing coursework and exams through Virtual ATI, a newly enacted e-learning program at BVROP designed to offer students experience with material and questions they will be asked to complete on the NCLEX. The software was purchased for the LVN program to assist with focusing areas of study based on each student's performance during quizzes and exams. Students are able to concentrate on challenging areas and improve where necessary.

Dr. Mahmoud and Baldy View ROP staff also participated in mock interviews to help prepare students for job interviews as they begin to establish their career as Licensed Vocational Nurses. Professional success beyond the classroom remains a focus for all. Congratulations to all graduates! We wish you the very best!
