

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

The competition was organized by the California Association of Dance/Drill Team Directors, which is a non-profit organization throughout California dedicated to providing students with opportunities to work in teams as well as learn how to rehearse and work effectively and efficiently in class in order to perform well on stage.

Instructor Jarrell discussed the value of competition for students as they develop their ability to work under pressure.

"Students learn how to cope with nervousness and focus amidst adrenaline during their performances," she said. "At this competition, they got to interact with dozens of experienced professionals working in the dance profession each year.

CHHS senior Gemini Cifuentes

Students taking the Health Support Services course with Instructor Julianne Baun at Chino Hills High School (CHHS) in Chino Valley Unified School District gain valuable preparation not only for their future careers in healthcare, but also practical medical experience they can use in their lives today. Course curriculum covers basic first-aid for use in emergency situations and CPR training. Students also have the opportunity to explore various healthcare occupations and learn fundamental skills such as checking various vital signs.

CHHS senior Brandon Trueman is on his high school's varsity football team and finds interest in the course curriculum.

"I play football so I like learning how the human body works and what the different muscles are," he shared.

CHHS senior Gemini Cifuentes has already used the training she learned in her ROP courses in a life-altering way. Gemini recently used CPR on her brother and was the first to respond to his medical needs during a sudden emergency that took place during a water polo match.

Gemini's brother was in the middle of playing water polo when his heart skipped a beat. He slowly made his way over to the side of the pool to exit, which was Gemini's first indication that her brother needed help.

"People actually started laughing at him as he left the game because he was moving so slowly. Usually water polo players move so quickly so they thought he looked funny," Gemini shared. "I could tell right away something was wrong. I turned to my dad and told him, 'Something is happening.""

Gemini immediately left the bleachers and ran down to the poolside and instructed those around the team to help turn him over on his back. She administered CPR to her brother. Gemini's ability to act quickly is something she credits to her ROP courses. She also took the ROP Healthcare Occupations course at CHHS with Instructor Baun the previous year.

As the Cifuentes family soon found out, Gemini's brother had an underlying medical condition in which one of his arteries was routed the wrong way to his heart. The condition was corrected with open heart surgery.

Instructor Baun praised Gemini for her quick reaction, noting her many qualities not only as a promising student but as a caring person.

"She's amazing. She has a huge heart and really cares about others. She's also really focused on her future career," Instructor Baun said.

Gemini would like to be an RN after she graduates high school and credits her ROP courses with inspiring her future goals.

"What happened to my brother really demonstrated to me why my ROP courses are so important. They have inspired my career goals and I owe so much to Instructor Baun. She's a very inspirational teacher."

Articulation Exam Success!

Articulation is a formal agreement that aligns courses between Baldy View ROP and community colleges. Articulated courses provide students with the opportunity to earn credit at participating colleges if they pass articulation exams at the completion of their ROP course.

18 students who completed the Baldy View ROP Healthcare Occupations course at the BVROP Career Training Center this fall semester have now earned college credit by passing their articulation exam! The students took an 150 question exam on medical terminology. The pass rate ensures that they have earned 3 college credits to apply either towards the Mt. San Antonio College Medical Terminology course or the Chaffey College Beginning Medical Terminology course. Students who passed

the exam attend BVROP partnering schools including Alta Loma, Chaffey, Etiwanda, Montclair, Ontario, and Valley View High Schools within Chaffey Joint Union High School District as well as Ayala and Chino High Schools within Chino Valley Unified School District. Steven Zamudio gained his first exposure to career skills while attending Valley View High School in Chaffey Joint Union High School District in the 1970's. BVROP was still a young organization at the time as it was founded in 1972. Steven took the ROP Residential Wiring course. The course's schedule demanded that Steven get up well before his typical school day started to learn about outfitting homes with proper electrical equipment.

"The hardest part was getting up very early in the morning and doing our projects on houses before school started. We worked on houses for those in need at the time.

Something I say about ROP is that it gets kids out of bed and learning about getting a job!" he shared.

Today, Mr. Zamudio is the Haz Mat Coordinator for the Environmental Health and Safety Department for Steelscape, his employer of the last 28 years. Mr. Zamudio is passionate about his work and for the last few years has attended Career Day events at Ramona Junior High School to talk about his job and get students interested in exploring different career options. He also shared that his experience in ROP prepared him for his current job by helping him at an early age to see the value of hard work and how to be accountable to his company.

"Not everyone who comes to work every day knows what it takes to give it their all. ROP courses show students early on what it means to work and that everything they do in their jobs has an impact on other people, so it's important to come to work knowing you're part of a team. I'm so glad that ROP is still available to students and has grown so much since I was in high school, because today we need it more than ever."



On January 22, we held an information session led by Special Projects & Grants Liaison/Program Specialist - Curriculum Development Shawneece Coyle. Industry professionals attended to learn about the latest developments in the pathway which included a discussion about the current instructor vacancies that we are looking to fill. Superintendent Shelley Adams, Ed.D. and Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services Forest DeRenzo, Ed.D. also addressed those in attendance.

We will be hiring two instructors, one for the course to be taught at Claremont High School and

the other to be taught at our Career Training Center. Both courses will begin fall 2019 and positions are currently posted on Edjoin at www.edjoin.org.

"It was great having attendance by industry professionals who know the logistics industry and have a passion for teaching and educating youth to get them ready for the workforce," Special Projects & Grants Liaison/Program Specialist - Curriculum Development Coyle said.

Health Workforce Initiative


This December, Baldy View ROP secured a \$9,000 grant from the HWI in order to fun a series of promotional videos in support of our Health Science and Medical Technology courses.




